Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1

Year 1 have come back from the half term all refreshed and striving in their new learning. In Literacy, we are completing storyboards to write a detailed retell of 'Zog' before we move on to a new story! We have been persevering to up-level our work to use powerful vocabulary.

In Maths, we have begun exploring addition using part whole models. It

was challenging at first but now we are confident at recognising the two parts to add so that we can count accurately to find the whole number.





In Topic, we are beginning to focus on London and the Royal family. We have started by recognising and naming famous London landmarks. In Art, we started a new mood board of London to share our thoughts and ideas. We have also been exploring materials in Science. We have been investigating materials used for different purposes around our school so that we can decide the best materials to build our own castles for battle!

Year 2

Year 2 have had a brilliant start back from the half term holidays. In topic, we have started to learn about the Chilean mining disaster in 2010 and have written a diary entry to show what the miners must have felt like. We have asked a lot of questions about the disaster and can't quite believe how long they were trapped for. We were so impressed with the amount of people that were able to come to our Mining Workshop on Tuesday 13th November. All of us thoroughly enjoyed ourselves and we enjoyed sharing our knowledge! We are also looking forward to showcasing our work at the end of the topic on *Thursday 13th December* straight after school. As mentioned at the workshop, the event will cost 50p to attend so that we are able to adopt a pit pony at the National Coal Mining Museum – please look out for our persuasive letters to invite you!








In Maths, we have continued to learn about addition and subtraction. We can now use a range of methods for both calculations and are more confident to spot patterns in numbers.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 3

Year 3 have been working hard in Maths to develop their understanding of adding and subtracting using three digit numbers, they have also been finding missing numbers in calculations where they have developed their confidence when exchanging. In Literacy, Year 3 have been very engaged in learning about the Titanic, where they have positioned themselves in the life of a passenger to write a diary

entry of the day they boarded the Titanic. Children have thoroughly enjoyed



learning about this time era and been very inquisitive to learning all about the passengers, the ship itself and the events of the disaster. From this, they have completed observational drawings of the ship and used oil pastels to add detail.

Year 4

Year 4 have enjoyed delving deeper into the importance of Ancient Greek culture and explored different Ancient Greek cities. They undertook different research and exploration tasks outside to investigate Athens, Sparta and Knossos in Crete before writing an informative report about Ancient Greek Cities. They enjoyed using masks to act out myths, imagining they were in the first theatres in Athens, created their own minotaur's maze and gathered information using the ipads about Spartan warriors. Since then we have begun to learn about the Anglo Saxon hero myth Beowulf and discovered who the Anglo Saxons were and why they came to Britain.

In Maths, we have been perfecting our column subtraction method and applying it to multistep problems. We have investigated different efficient methods of subtracting four digit numbers including subtracting one from each number before doing the calculation if subtracting from a multiple of a thousand. (e.g. For 6000 – 2846 calculate 5999 – 2845)





This method avoids having to exchange a lot and uses the concept of the two calculations having a common difference. We also practised using the inverse to check addition and subtraction calculations.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 5

Year 5 have been working hard in Maths to develop their understanding of Statistics, presented in different ways. We have mastered line graphs and we are now looking at two-way tables.

In Literacy we are debating "School Uniforms – Good or Bad?" and we have been considering the many



different groups of people who have opinions on this!



During PE, we are developing our understanding of 1940s Dance, currently focussing on the Jive! The children have been impressing us with their ability to persevere with new steps and they had an excellent effort at dancing (in time!) with a partner this week.

Year 6

Year 6 have been working hard to understand fractions. We have been improving our fluency and reasoning. This week we have been looking at using the 4 operations with fractions and will be moving onto consolidating how fractions, decimals and percentages all link.



In Literacy, we have been writing our own instructions for how to preserve fruit and vegetables, using the methods that Ancient Egyptians used.

During Topic work we have been writing in role as people with different jobs in Ancient Egypt and in Computing we have started to look at coding - we are enjoying entering the algorithms and finding any mistakes!
