Frozen Planet



This week, the children have been inspired to plan, construct and devise their own games using arctic animals, game boards and construction materials. We are so impressed at their imagination and perseverance with this. The children have also used corks to print igloo's and a variety of white and blue collage materials to create arctic animals. They have had so much fun fishing for food, building snow mobiles and dog sleds as well as using our newly formed 'milk bottle' igloo area to develop narratives about the arctic. Next week, we will be investigating ice and the northern

lights in more detail. During the week, we have been excited to observe the

construction of the wooden sand kitchen. The children have been asking lots of questions about the work and can't wait until it's completed.

Literacy

During the week, the children enjoyed researching and reading facts our non-fiction books then writing their own sentences to create their own factual booklet. We are going to pursue this further next week, by creating a whole class factual booklet about our 'Frozen planet'.
