Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have had an extremely busy two weeks! In Literacy, we have been focusing on developing our phenomenal vocabulary. We have been analysing the vocabulary in 'Cuddly Dudley' and learning the definitions so that we can up-level and re-draft our retells with amazing vocabulary, ready for our published write.



In Maths, we have continued to explore place value with numbers



up to 50. However, we are now using base ten and a range of Mathematical resources to support us to use inequality symbols so that we can compare amounts and numbers, order numbers and find 1 more and 1 less.

On Tuesday, we took part in our outdoor learning day with Eden's forest to develop our topic learning about the Antarctic. We mapped out the world, located the Northern and Southern Hemisphere, and discussed which parts of the world that penguins lived. After discovering different types of penguins, we

used natural resources to create collage penguins and construct model penguins. We also discussed Global Warming and the ef-



fects it was having across the World and used role-play to extend our understanding.

<u>Year 2</u>

In Literacy we have focused on reading non chronological reports and have created our



own factual introductions and sub headings. We have started to research different features of African life such as places, buildings, animals and food ready to use in our final reports.

In Maths, we have started to learn about tally charts and pictograms. We have looked at how to create an accurate tally and how our 5 times table knowledge can help us when counting

them. We created a class pictogram where we all chose our favourite African animal and used mathematical sentence openers to write reasoning sentences explaining what the information the pictogram told us.



Finally, we had a fantastic trip to Wakefield Cathedral where we had an amazing tour of



the building, learnt all about the signs and symbols belonging to the Christian religion and completed some activities that made us think carefully about who and what we appreciate and why. We asked lots of questions so that we could find out as much information as we could about all the different areas of the Cathedral and why it is important to people.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 3





Year 3 have had a fantastic couple of weeks, they have been writing instructions to recipes to prepare for their trip to the Glynn. Here they baked jam and lemon tarts, sausage rolls and butterfly buns to take with them to the Glynn, where we took these up with us,

along with books and songs learnt to entertain the elderly. The children thoroughly enjoyed their trip to the Glynn and so did the elderly. In Maths, the children have continued to develop their knowledge about money where they have applied their skills of adding and subtracting money to solve one-step and twostep problems linked to money. In topic, the children have continued to consider our local community where they have located different human and physical characteristics that are in





our local community. This was particularly completed when we visited the post office to post our letters to the Glynn.

Year 4

Year 4 had a fascinating day at the Renewi Education at Shanks Recycling Centre on Tuesday. We learned about the problems with rubbish and how the recycling centre sorts and processes household waste ready for recycling. It was a really engaging and informative day. We loved being waste detectives and sorting out different rubbish on the conveyer belt. We also enjoyed our tour of the HWRC as well as making our own wallets from empty juice cartons.



In Science, we have been learning about how animals



are adapted to their habitat and made our own animals adapted to living in the rainforest. Following this, we learned about how the animals in an ecosystem are interdependent and form food chains that always start with a producer which is a plant.

In Maths, we have been calculating area and making shapes with containing different numbers of squares. We have been using powerful vocabulary as well as similes and metaphors to write our own poem with a message in literacy and have begun to explore adventure stories.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

<u>Year 5</u>

Year 5 have been generating ideas for fable stories in Literacy, using Rudyard Kipling's Just-So Stories as our stimulus. We enjoyed creating a role play with a moral and performing this to an audience of Reception children on Monday!

In Maths, we have recapped our knowledge of fractions and we will be continuing to develop in widen-



ing our understanding of fractions after the half term break.



Geography has been our focus in topic – where we have been outlining how mountains are formed through the movement of tectonic plates. During Art, we have experimented with our printmaking techniques using a variety of art media to develop our Mandala designs.

<u>Year 6</u>

Year 6 have been learning about ratio. We consolidated our learning by creating our own ratio visuals and word problems. We have also been critiquing our fantastic diary entries, using Wonder as our stimulus. One of our favourite quotes from the book so far is, 'When given the choice between being right and being kind, choose kind.'

We have been continuing to learn how to expand our answers and explanations when reading. We have also been doing some practise tests to help us work out what we are gaining confidence in and what areas we need to further develop. We have also spent some time improving





our times tables using Times Table Rockstars and challenging each other in class.

In P.E we have used the dance steps that we have learnt to create our own sequences. There has been some fantastic teamwork from everyone in class! During Art lessons, we have continued to learn about Pablo Picasso's influence on Cubism, creating our own cubist inspired portraits.
