<u>Year 1</u>

Wow! What a busy two weeks it has been. Thank you to everyone who could attend our Appreciation Assembly. It was a brilliant opportunity to showcase the children's learning journey and their beautiful writing.



In Literacy, we have been writing a retell of 'The Robot and The Bluebird'. As we are becoming confident independent writers, we have now been focussing on developing the quality of our sentences. We have been developing and reflecting on our vocabulary choice and using adverbs to add extra description and detail to our sentences. Our retells are phenomenal and we cannot wait to publish them!

In Maths, we have completed our work on measuring and we are now learning about multiplication and division. We have begun by recapping our counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and we are applying this skill to solve times tables.


In Art, we have been using our artist inspiration 'Andrew Davidson' to help us design and create our own robots. We have used black and white card and 2D shapes to collage and layer our robots. We have used our shading and blending techniques to create a 3D effect.

<u>Year 2</u>

In Literacy we have created our own poems based on the vocabulary we have learnt from 'The Ugly Five'. The children thought really carefully about rhyming words and alliteration in their work. We are now moving onto writing instructions and look forward to creating a tasty African treat next week to help us write our own set of instructions.

In Maths, we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes and are amazing at using the properties to describe many different shapes. We have also enjoyed practical maths lessons





where we had to follow clues to create 3d shapes out of straws and modelling clay. We are now looking forward to learning about fractions especially $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$.

Finally, we have started to create our African masks using our mood boards as inspiration for the colours and shapes that we have used. We had to use lots of perseverance to cut out all of our templates that we used!

<u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 have had a fantastic few weeks, they have been working really hard



in their writing and topic to produce an informative campaign to tell the local community about the areas of improvement we have proposed for Wrenthorpe. The children's confi-



dence and pride shone through when we visited the Village Hall to showcase our ideas where they spoke confidently to all families, friends and local residents to tell them about what we were trying to achieve.

In Maths, the children have been learning all about units of measurement, when we baked for the Village Hall, it gave the children a real sense of purpose as they could use units of measure to weigh out all the ingredients. Finally, in Art, the children have been learning different sewing techniques where they have started to complete their community designs.

<u>Year 4</u>



Thank you to everyone who made it to our parent assembly showcasing our learning on our topic so far. We feel like we have learned a lot about the impact humans can have on the natural world, both on the rainforest and in the oceans. In Literacy, we are now researching the problem with plastic and about how to live a sustainable life so that we can pro-



duce informative leaflets. We are looking forward to sharing them in our sustainability tent at Jerry Fest.

In Maths, we have been learning to calculate fractions of quantities, such as three eighths of twenty four by dividing by the denominator and multiplying by the numerator. We have now started to understand that decimals are based on tenths and hundredths. In Art, we have been using water colour paints, blending and merging colours to produce paintings of flowers in the style of Georgia O'Keefe for the Wrenthorpe Flower Show.



<u>Year 5</u>

Year 5 have just returned from an amazing visit to London! We had such a special time, making memories! Our visit started on Wednesday morning, setting off from school very early on the coach! We stopped for snacks and then arrived in London ready for the afternoon performance of THE LION KING! It was spectacular – we were so impressed by the acting, music, costumes and props! Just mesmerising. We then went to our hotel for the evening – the historical warship HMS Belfast where we had a giant sleepover including pizza and a film!

On Thursday morning, we woke up bright and early ready for a new day of adventure. Starting off with breakfast, we then had some time on the decks of HMS Belfast and learnt more about the history of the ship. After that, we caught the river cruise boat down




We then caught the cruise back to the Tower of London,
