

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1

What a busy two weeks back into the new half term! Year 1 have set fantastic expectations in their learning and have been striving every day!

In Literacy, we have introduced our new core text, 'The Robot and The Bluebird' and began by immersing ourselves into the

> story. There is a beautiful theme of belonging and making others feel special, which coincides with our topic 'What does it mean to belong?'. This week we have been acters.



In Maths, we have finished our unit of measuring length and height and we have now moved onto measuring mass and capacity. This week, we have spent a lot of time measuring and weighing in the outdoor areas. We have

been applying our understanding of using scales to measure mass using

nonstandard units.

In Art, we have introduced our artist inspiration 'Andrew Davidson' and we have started studying his illustrations of 'The Iron Man' to inspire our sketches of robots for our published final Art piece.

Year 2

In Literacy we have revealed our core text for the next few weeks 'The Ugly Five'. We have read and discussed exciting vocabulary



and created our own sentences, using these words, to describe animals from the story. We are working towards writing our own poem featuring some of these animals.

In Maths, we have started looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We have had several outdoor learning lessons finding and creating 2D shapes and have used

mirrors to identify shapes

that have lines of symmetry.

Finally, we have started researching Nelson Mandela in our topic lessons. We read the book 'Long Walk to Freedom' and have started to create a detailed fact file. The children have been bringing in some fantastic pieces of work that they have done at home as they have been so inspired by our topic. It is fantastic to see how enthusiastic they are about their learning. Well done!





Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 3



Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the second half of the Spring term, we have continued to think about our local community and consider how communities may differ. We further developed our knowledge of Judaism through visiting a synagogue this week, the children found this very educational where they used brilliant enquiry skills to ask lots of questions to deepen their understanding. In Maths, we have been looking at statistics using bar charts, pictograms and tables to interpret the data produced, we will now be moving onto our next topic of measurements.

Year 3 have also started to consider how to make improvements to our community, for this to happen, the children completed a survey where they asked other children questions to find out what areas we could improve. From this we will be holding a gallery in the afternoon of **Monday 18th March** at Wrenthorpe Village Hall for all families, friends and local residents to attend and support. The event will consist of presenting the work the children have already completed and showcase what we are wishing to accomplish next. This being improving our local community through either introducing commu-



nity gardens or a pedestrian crossing, or having access to more recycling bins within the local area. We look forward to seeing you there!

Year 4

Year 4 have been exploring the importance of the oceans on the planet Earth as well as how plastic pollution and climate change are affecting the living things that live there. In Geography, we learned that sea turtles date back from the time of the dinosaurs but that many species are now endangered. We explored the issues that are affecting them and role played being a sea turtle scientist whose job it is to protect them.


On Tuesday we had a fabulous Survival day with Eden's Forest based on our class novel Explorer by Katherine Rundell. We imagined we were stranded in the rainforest and had to survive by building a shelter, transporting water, starting fires and finding food. What an exciting day that we will be using to inspire some thrilling adventure stories.



In Maths, we have begun learning about fractions including equivalent fractions and fractions greater than 1. We have made great start at our swimming lessons at Sun Lane Swimming Baths.

Year 5



Year 5 have had a busy fortnight! We have been busy completing our Just-So-Stories and our next adventure in Literacy will be based around the picture book "The Arrival".


We have started our new Topic core text "The Boy at the Back of the class" which is helping us to understand some of the troubles and anxieties that a refugee might encounter, as well as the importance of being kind to people and welcoming them. On Tuesday afternoon, we were visited by Wakefield City of Sanctuary and Mahmoud – a refugee – who discussed his experiences with us. It was so insightful and really made us think.

During our Maths lessons, we are developing our understanding of improper fractions, mixed numbers and calculating using these (adding and subtracting). We are working hard to link concepts now and represent our answers in different ways.


Year 6

This week Year 6 have been learning about statistics and how to interpret different types of graphs, including line graphs. We are continuing to strengthen our arithmetic and reasoning skills.

During Literacy, we have been discussing balanced arguments and debating topics such as 'Do Premier League footballers get paid too much?' and, 'Should children be allowed to use the internet independently?'. We have used cohesive devices, formality and looked at this from different perspectives to structure our balanced arguments. We have



also spent some time outside practising our grammar skills and using commas in sentences.



During Science we have investigated what happens to our heart rates during different exercises and created line graphs using this data.
