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Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA


<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have had a brilliant week and made a fantastic start to the final half term! We have been incredibly busy completing our art pieces for the Creative Arts gallery. Our genie lamps are finished and painted, our Rangoli inspired candle jars are decorated and we have almost completed our



own magic carpets. We have been adding our final layer of detail on top and edging our carpets with tassels and ribbons.

In Literacy, we have created our fantastic newspaper articles, reporting the events of the genie lamp in our classroom. We have persevered to up-level our vocabulary, redraft our work and have presented our work



beautifully in our published writing. It was hard work but we were determined to make it the best that we can be! We have used tea bags to stain our paper to create an ancient effect.

In Maths, we have continued our work with fractions. We can now explain what one quarter and one half look like as a fraction, an object and in a shape. We are moving on to be able to find one quarter of an

amount and a number.

<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have continued their hard work from Creative Arts Week since returning to school. We have



continued learning about Peter Pan and have completed our story re-tells from a character's point of view. When published, these


will then be added to our pop-up cards that we made during Creative Arts Week. Next week, we will be finishing our 3D map of Neverland and some children will be chosen to paint a scene from our fairy tale.

In topic, we have continued



learning about extreme weather. We have all been able to create a piece of writing to explain how different types of weather happen and to describe what extreme weather might look like.

<u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 have had a very exciting few weeks. Creative Arts Week on the last week of term was brilliant, where we have continued the writing and art through to the following week. We have been focusing on the fairy tale 'Cinderella,' where the children have produced some fantastic play scripts following a modern version of the story, the children have then completed some drama in relation to this, where they have also retold the story of Cinderella. We utilised the main objects in the story of Cinderella to base our Art around, here we completed some observational drawings of shoes, designed and


decorated our own shoes and

produced a 3D life size fireplace. Year 3 also have been designing and

creating a life size Cinderella carriage using cardboard, papier mache and chicken wire.

Year 3 have had a great start to the Summer 2 Term, we have started looking at time and using the analogue clock to answer related questions. We have also continued our gardening project where the children have been watering the plants and maintaining the garden, we

have also been thinking about in Science what plants need to survive and the different parts of plants.



<u>Year 4</u>



Year 4 have enjoyed learning about the lesser known fairy tale The Wild

Swans inspired by the theme Once Upon A time from Creative Arts Week. We began with an outdoor trail of clues about the story before learning about the story through mime and story telling. The children have written in role as one of the eleven brothers in the story, imagining what it would have been like to turn into swans! Taking the theme of freedom present in the story, we have also been work-



ing hard to make a large class sculpture based on the idea of swan's wings. The children have used so many different art media to make their own feathers: sketching pencil, charcoal, chalk, oil pastel and chalk pastel and

our favourite the scratch resist feathers. The finished wings are stunning – but a closely guarded secret until the Art Gallery on the 19th!

In maths, have been pushing ourselves to use money in problem solving, striving to solve complex and multi-step problems and to find more than one way of calculating them. We have also been telling the time to the nearest minute and learning to convert between units of time. In Science we are now learning about the states of matter, solids, liquids and gases, and how materials can change state.

We have been working hard on trying to write monologues which prove the innocence of the witch within Hansel and Gretel, in preparation for Creative Arts Week.
