

## Year 1

Year 1 have had an incredibly busy few weeks! Thank you for sharing our work on Aladdin with us at our Creative Arts Gallery. On Tuesday, we had an amazing time on our visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park, despite the miserable weather. The children were exceptionally well behaved and were commented on by members of the park, and the coach driver, for their exceptional manners.

After visiting the Yorkshire Wildlife Park, we have been writing a recount to record all the animals we observed and the interesting facts we learnt. We have been striving to use question marks so that we can include all our facts. We have

persevered to redraft and improve our recount, particularly striving to develop our exciting use of vocabulary.

During Maths, we have been developing our understanding of position and direction. We have been striving to use mathematical vocabulary, such as clockwise, anticlockwise, left and right to navigate the Beebot and our partners around obstacles.

In the afternoon, we had the opportunity to create our own weather collage using natural materials which looked fantastic! Other events have included Sports Day and the Creative Arts Gallery.

In class, we have continued to learn about the weather. We received a special video from the ITV weatherman, Jon Mitchell, and have written and published letters in reply to him! In art, we have created our own weather collages and in DT, we have started to design and make our own weather mobiles and will be using these to measure the different types of weather in Wrenthorpe!

## Year 3



Year 3 have had a fantastic few weeks! We had a fantastic trip on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> June to Canon Hall Farm. The children walked excitedly around the Farm learning all about the different animals there were there. During this time, the children watched a ferret race and a sheep race and learned all about meercats! We then had a guided tour around the Farm where we learnt all about pigs, cows and sheep before watching the cows being milked in the milking parlour. The children loved their trip to the Farm and learnt so much from their trip; this has been identified in the shape poems they have



produced which describe the different animals they had seen. Other events have included Sports Day and the Creative Arts Gallery where the children's fantastic writing and art work was displayed.



In class, we have continued to learn about farming and gardening where we have been taking real care with our allotment to help the produce grow. The produce is beginning to grow on all the plants so we are hoping to be holding a farmers market in the last week of term to showcase the produce and the products we have made from this.

## Year 4



Year 4 have had an exciting time over the past few weeks. Our trip to Yorkshire Sculpture Park was great fun and an opportunity to work with an artist to explore Surreal Structures and 3D form: sculptures and architecture. We enjoyed finding out about different sculptures at the park and what different sculptors wanted their sculptures to represent. We sketched different viewpoints and then spent a great afternoon making our own machetes (models) of imaginary and



surreal buildings from junk and Modroc. Back in school we will be completing our models and painting them. We have started to find out about the Catalan architect Gaudi who also created surreal buildings in Barcelona.

In Literacy, we have been writing a biography about the aviation pioneer Amelia Earhart and in Maths we have been learning about statistics, drawing and interpreting bar charts, pictograms and line graphs. Our next Maths topic is Properties of Shape including angles, types of triangles and quadrilaterals and lines of symmetry.

In Science, we have been finding out about how water evaporates and we designed our own fair test to explore what factors speeds up evaporation. We had to measure amounts of water carefully and make sure we only changed one variable in the investigation so that our results were reliable.

## Year 5



Year 5 have had an amazingly busy few weeks! We had an amazing time on our visit to QEGS, who kindly invited us to their school for a Science day. The children were so well-behaved and extremely polite, which was commented on by others. Setting the JCA way!

To support our work in Literacy and Geography, we have been reading Room 13 – a novel full of mystery and suspense. We have looked up Whitby on the map and features of Whitby by looking at OS symbols. Whitby is the focal setting of the story. Some of us have also put our symbol work into practise by starting to map our 'perfect island'.



During Maths, we have advanced our understanding of 2d shapes and angles. The children have worked extremely hard on this – and are now masters of the protractor. We can also reason and solve problems linked to shapes. Our next Maths unit is measurement.
