
Dear Parents

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

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1

The last two weeks have been very busy in Year 1! We have been focusing on our story of 'Zog', re-

telling the story and then re-drafting it to include lots of vocabulary which the children have enjoyed thoroughly.

The children have also enjoyed drawing dragon eyes in their art lesson. This

has involved trialing out different sketching techniques and designing a dragon eye using a variety of these techniques. The children and I were really proud of their attention to detail including the spots of light on to their pupils.

In Maths we have started addition and subtraction. Although challenging, all children are beginning to grasp this really well and can add numbers between 0-10 counting on in their head.

We have also had exciting Computing lessons using the bee- bots! The children loved using the bee- bots, the bee- bot app on the

iPads and acting as bee- bots themselves outside on an obstacle course instructing their partners using instructions of where to go.

Year 2

Year 2 have been extremely busy over the last couple of weeks and have been striving to rise to Year 2 expectations! In Literacy, we have been striving to apply a range of skills such as using onomatopoeias, ellipsis, short sentences and exciting vocabulary to build suspense and excitement in our mining adventure stories!

In Maths, we have been applying our understanding of place value to help us solve addition and subtraction problems. We have just begun exploring the column method to add and subtract tens and ones.



In History, we have been researching historical events in coal mining to create and explain a detailed timeline. We enjoyed learning new facts about coal mining and we were especially interested in the

miner's strikes.















In Art, we have created our final art piece for our topic 'Magnificent Miners' based on our artist inspiration 'Valerie Ganz'. We layered the background using lighter and darker shades of white and black and pastels to create our miner in the foreground.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 3

Over the last few weeks, Year 3 have been working exceptionally hard to produce some fantastic work. We finished off our dinosaurs topic where the



children produced some beautiful pieces of art work which are now being displayed in the classroom. We have now developed our learning on to look at the Stone Age now, where in Literacy, the children have been thinking about this time era when writing an adventure story about going back in time, based on the book 'A Stone Age Boy'. In History, we have been learning all about The Stone Age where the children have started to look at cave paintings before they produce their own; here they have



tea dyed paper to give it an old, authentic feel. Finally, in Maths, Year 3 are developing from strength to strength. We have been looking at developing our knowledge of adding 3-digit numbers where we have start-

ed learning how to exchange and solve word problems.

Year 4

Year 4 are hooked on Ancient Greek myths now! We have produced written some powerful retellings



of the hero Perseus taking on the hideous Medusa in 'The Gor-

gon's Cave' and have now begun learning about instruction writing so that we can compile a handy Hero's Handbook containing useful information about how to defeat mythical beasts. In History, we have been learning the names of Ancient Greek



cities and how they helped to change the world. We explored Corinth, Knossos and Athens in outdoor activities before researching these and other cities of Sparta, Olympia and Delphi using the internet and writing an informative report.

In Maths, we have been moving on our use of addition and subtraction including the written column method and mental methods involving adding tens and hundreds and crossing the boundary into the next hundred or thousand. We have been particularly focusing on solving more complex problems and being the teacher where we have to spot the mistake, explain it and correct it.

Year 5

Year 5 enjoyed a fantastic visit to Eden Camp last week- in the words of one pupil "It was awesome!" We learnt so much and found it very interesting although some of it was was quite frightening. The puppet show was great fun, finding out how people might have been entertained during WWII (including getting wet!)

In our Maths lessons, we have been consolidating our addition and subtraction skills especially problem solving using these operations. We have been challenged to solve multi step problems or problems presented in dif-

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ferent ways.

We have enjoyed learning about 'The

Blitz' in our History and Literacy learning, including role play - listening to the air raid siren and practising Blackouts in class. In Art, we are busy designing ideas in our sketchbooks for our clay piece linked to our current class novel.




Year 6
