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Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

<u>Year 1</u>

As we are drawing this half term to a close the children have had a lovely two weeks really focussing on their art and published writing. Their writing in literacy has been amazing to see improve from those first couple of weeks in year one. They are now on display in the classroom for all to see.



In Maths we have started working on our number bonds



to ten, this has been challenging to some but they have enjoyed the physical games we have played as well as using other resources to help find the missing number needed to make ten.

In Art we have been developing upon our drawing techniques by using paint to print our dragon eyes. We have also been finger painting to create their own Autumn picture, they mixed colours and created a lovely field picture which will be displayed at the harvest gallery.

They also had the opportunity to make their own apple juice. They pressed the apples themselves and all had the chance to taste their juice.

<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have been incredibly busy over the last two weeks! For our topic 'Magnificent Miners', we have published our mining adventures stories and we have created our final piece of art work based on our artist inspiration 'Valerie Ganz'.

In Maths, we have been striving to use column addition to help us solve addition problems. At first, it was quite tricky partitioning the tens and



ones, but now we can add 2 digit numbers while exchanging tens.

This week in Literacy, we have been developing beautiful Harvest shape poems to celebrate Harvest festival. We have enjoyed learning about alliteration and including onomatopoeia into our poems. Also, we have been striving to develop exciting vocabulary and included excellent adjectives such as 'exquisite' and 'formidable'!

In Art, Year 2 have been using clay to shape and carve different fruit and vegetables for our Harvest basket.

<u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 have had a fantastic few weeks, they have been continuing to develop their knowledge of addition and subtraction where they have really been challenging themselves to complete missing number sentences and word problems. In Literacy, we have



finished completing our Stone Age stories which are now on display alongside their cave paintings. We have also been developing our knowledge of play scripts where the children have wrote



their own plays surrounding the Harvest festival.

Year 3 thoroughly enjoyed our trip to the Yorkshire Museum, the children participated in a range of different pre-historic workshops, including weaving, pottery making and building Stone Age tepees. This largely developed their knowledge and understanding surrounding pre-historic times which they have then applied in their History.

<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 have been exploring Harvest based on the song Harvest for the World by The Islay brothers. We explored where our food comes from by looking on food packaging and then locating the countries using an atlas and marking them on a world map. We discovered that not everyone has enough to eat and that often those people who grow



and harvest our food are themselves hungry. We found out about fair trade and about food poverty in the UK and around the world. This inspired us to write our own poems about Harvest for the World.

In Literacy, we have then being using everything we have learned about Greek myths to write our own set of instructions for 'A Hero's Handbook'. We have been practising using precise imperative verbs and adverbs. In Art, We made our own Greek mask by drawing a dramatic face in proportion and layering pieces of cardboard in low relief before adding depth and detail with charcoal.

It has been fantastic to see the progression of the children's dance skills throughout the half term working with Miss Hoyte. Our finished street dance routine is fantastic.

Finally, it has been a great week in Maths. Firstly, we were a brilliant team taking on Year 5 in a Times Tables Rock Stars Battle and (almost!) beating them in one of the highest scoring battles yet in school. We're hooked! A re-match has begun and ends on the first morning back after the holidays. Come on Year 4! We have also been learning different mental and written methods for subtraction and being flexible to choose the most efficient method. We have also been focussing on solving complex and multi step problems involving addition and subtraction.

Year 5



We have been developing our understanding of statistics in Maths, learning all about line graphs, tables and two-way tables. Lots of us have been striving on TT Rockstars to develop our speed of times tables to help achieve our next Diamond dash level.

In Literacy, we have been drafting, editing and publishing our newspaper articles; these are based on a Luftwaffe plane

crash at Budmouth Point, which is a fictional location in our class story. The children have shown so much enthusiasm whilst completing these!

During Art, we have been crafting our clay tiles. We practised different design elements before moulding onto a tile. We have enjoyed programming our own game using Scratch in Computing. This has included given a response depending on whether the answer is right or wrong, including awarding points (or taking them away!)

Year 6

Year 6 have been working hard to complete and paint our ancient Egyptian death masks. To go along-

side these, we have been writing diary entries from the perspective of Howard Carter discovering Tutenkahmun's tomb. We will be turning these into video diaries.

During Maths, we created long division tutorials and have been learning about the order of operations. In Science, we have been learning about the dissolving process using solutes and solvents (skittles and water). We have also been learning about harvest around the world.
