Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1



The last two weeks in Year 1 have been very exciting. We have started to write our own stories based on our text 'Jack and the Beanstalk' this has been very engaging for the children. They have provided some great imaginative ideas as to what their stories are about, for example 'Joanne and the Giant Carrot'!

In Maths we are focusing now on subtraction and looking at using objects to help us take away. The children have understood this concept really well

and we are eager to keep going.

The children have also had their exciting trip to Pontefract Castle as part of our topic; 'Dungeons and Dragons'. In the workshop they had chance to create dragon stories, design dragon masks and identify artefacts and clothing. They then explored the castle grounds dressed as dragons and went into the dungeons. All the children were amazed at the space and all the names etched into the

In Literacy, we have continued our non-chronological report on the National Coal Mining Museum. We have been striving to write in paragraphs in a formal tone with exciting vocabulary. We can't wait to publish them!

In Maths, we have started our new unit on money. It has been interesting to apply maths into a real life context and under-



stand how money is used in every day life. We can now identify coins and notes and have recently been learning to add a variety of pounds and pence together!

We have been very excited to begin our Nativity with Year 1! We have been learning our Nativity songs and lines together and we cannot wait to share it with you!

Year 3



Year 3 have had a fantastic few weeks continuing to look at the Titanic and the era this was set within. The children have been thinking about what it would be like during these times and what they would feel like if they were going to be board the Titanic. From this, the children completed some fantastic diary entries where they

wrote about the day they boarded the ship. In History, they have also been developing their understanding of different passengers that were on the ship and how their experiences would differ depending on which class they were a part of.

In Maths, the children have continued to develop their knowledge of multiplying and dividing, specifically using the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

Here the children have been applying this knowledge to a variety of different reasoning and problem solving questions.

Last week, parents from Year 3 visited school to complete 'The Lost World' workshop. This was a huge success where the children thoroughly enjoyed all the activities they were participating in along-side their parents, families and friends.

<u>Year 4</u>

It was great to learn more about the Anglo Saxons with our parents at the Workshop last week looking at images of artefacts such as the Sutton Hoo Helmet that have been unearthed by archaeologists and also making crafts related to Anglo Saxon life. In Literacy, we have reading the Anglo Saxon hero story Beo-

wulf and using a range of sentence types as well as descriptive vocabulary to retell the story. We can't wait to hear the final gripping adventure!

In DT, we have begun to learn about pneumatic systems so that we can make moving monsters linked with our Beowulf story.

In Maths, we have been learning to calculate the perimeter of shapes including rectangles and rectilinear shapes on a grid and using measure-

ments. We have also learned about measuring distances using kilometres and metres. It is fantastic to see so many children in Year 4 practising so hard on their times tables and this is really starting to pay off, with lots of children gaining certificates and being awarded with the coveted bronze, silver and gold badges! In Computing, we have been designing times tables quizzes for younger children and have enjoyed starting to program them

using 'if then else' blocks to give feedback when an answer is given.

Well done on such a busy couple of weeks!


