
Times Table Bingo

This is a simple but fun activity, which Year 2 love to do in class. On a piece of paper, whiteboard or any writing tool. Split your page into 6 squares. You can rotate between either writing the answers to the times table or the times table question. The person leading bingo either says the

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time table question or answer until someone has bingo. We have also used bingo for shape, numbers bonds or any learning in maths, even different lessons. E.g literacy and even Spanish!

Writing

In Literacy, we will continue our poetry focus on 'When the wind blows'. Unfortunately, this book is currently unavailable but we will continue to use the story on YouTube. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0YIMo-Qeq1I

As in the home learning overview, this week's literacy task is to begin to create ideas and sentences to include in their weather shape poem. As I would normally spend a week developing this in class, I have outlined how you could develop this over a week at home. **Remember this is just for guidance!**

Output

Description:

Monday – Comprehension activity.

Tuesday – Decide on your chosen weather you would like you poem to be about. E.g wind, rain, rainbows, sunshine, tornadoes etc. It can be any weather! Write the name and draw a picture of your chosen weather. Draw pictures and label all the different activities which might happen during your weather. Think about what people might be doing or feeling. What season is it? What might you be able to see? I will provide a template and an example of a WAGOLL on seesaw! It will look similar to five sense activity.

Your ideas for each sentence could start: When the sun shines/ When the rain pours/When thunder booms

Wednesday – Challenge your children to add expanded noun phrases to their descriptions of their weather and to up level to exciting vocabulary. An expanded noun phrase is an adjective, adjective noun. E.g delicate, fluffy cloud. To challenge yourself, could your sentence begin or end with onomatopoeia. E.G BANG! SWISH! SPLASH! I will provide a template and an example of a WAGOLL on seesaw!

Thursday – Year Two can now use their developed ideas to create their own short sentences to describe their chosen weather. Remember, these sentences will be used to create your poem so

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they do not need to but long sentences. Can use add an adverb to you sentences. An adverb describes 'how' and usually ends in the suffix 'ly'. E.g delicately, thoughtfully. E.g When the rain pours, umbrellas burst up frenetically like balloons.

Friday – Complete the DERIC activity, which will be set on seesaw. In class, we have been practising being active readers. When we are being active readers, we draw a wiggly line under any vocabulary we are unsure of so that we can discuss and work these out together. Also, we underline/circle any key clues we can already see E.g. characters names in the title, is it fiction or non-fiction, clues in the illustrations that will help us before we even start reading the story. Encourage your child to read the text a couple of times through before attempting the questions. When completing the questions, underline in the text when you find your answer.

SPAG

In your Year Two SPAG home learning pack. Please continue with your SPAG home learning packs. As we begin to use Seesaw, I will be uploading SPAG activities too with a different focus for each week. This week on seesaw, we will focus on adverbs to add extra detail to sentences.
