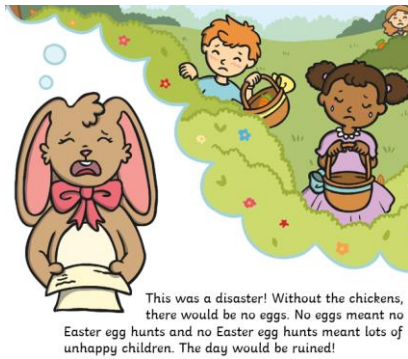
# Saving Easter

- String or twine



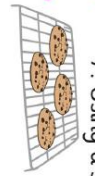

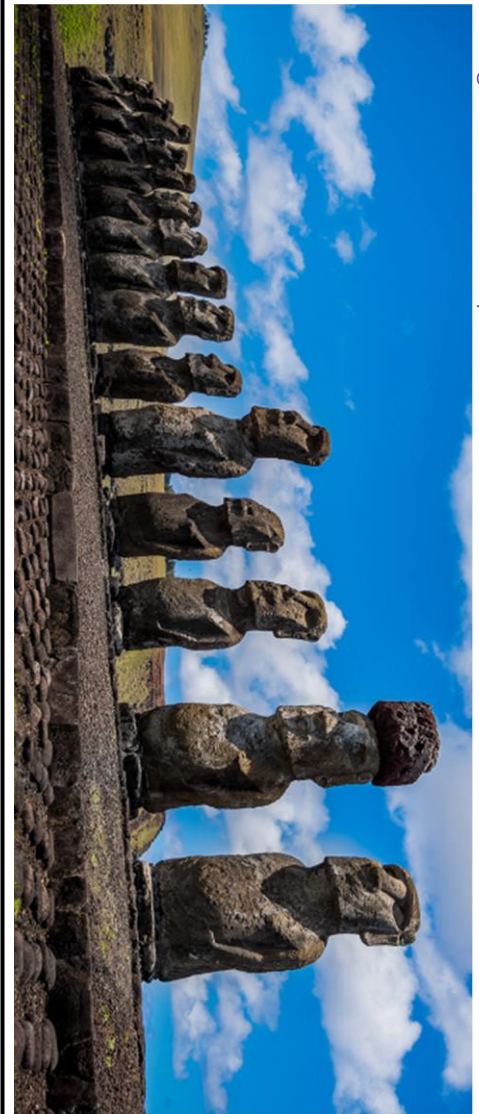
### How to make... Hot Cross Cookies

- | Ingredients                                       | Equipment                          |
|---|------------------------------------|
| 200g of softened butter, plus extra for the trays | Oven                               |
| 100g of light muscovado sugar                     | Two baking trays                   |
| 1 egg   | Large mixing bowl                  |
| 250g of plain flour                               | Sieve                              |
| 1 tsp of cinnamon                                 | Wooden Spoon                       |
| 2 tsp of baking powder                            | Small bowl (for chocolate melting) |
| 100g of sultanas                                  | Microwave                          |
| 200g of white chocolate chips                     | Piping bag (or teaspoon)           |
|   | Cooling rack                       |



1. Turn on the oven at 180°C or gas mark 4. Lightly butter the baking trays.
2. In the large bowl, beat the butter, sugar and egg until it is smooth.
3. Sift the flour, cinnamon and baking powder into the bowl and then combine to make a dough. After doing this, add the sultanas and 100g of the white chocolate chips. Mix everything together.
4. Roll lumps of dough into balls roughly the same size as golf balls. Flatten these onto the trays.
5. Bake in the oven for 10 minutes until they look golden and yummy.
6. When baked, remove the cookies from the tray and place them on a cooling rack. While they're cooling, get the remaining white chocolate and melt it in the microwave on low in 20 second bursts.
7. Using a small piping bag or a teaspoon, carefully drizzle a cross on top of each cookie. Leave the icing to set before eating.

### What you do...



Easter Island A remote volcanic island in the Pacific Ocean, Easter Island or Rapa Nui is famous for its ancient monumental statues named moai which date from the 13<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup> centuries. The moai are carved human figures with oversize heads resting on massive stone pedestals.

Think – What is the picture?  
 Challenge – sketch one of the statues.  
 Use shading and smudging to create texture.  
 Imagine - the statues came to life! What adventures would they have?
