I will continue to download two different activities each day for the children to complete using the Seesaw app/website. Remember that it is totally up to your child how they wish to present their learning.



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Maths

Using Seesaw to complete the daily Maths activity, using the White Rose Maths website and the templates on Seesaw. We are now on Summer Week 1 lessons and will complete these this week

Times table rockstars:

Writing

Man on the Moon

Watch the video and explore the man's thoughts. I have put the link and template on seesaw to try and make this easier but it does not have to be done this way.

Explore the little girl's thoughts – how does she feel about seeing the man up there? Write a poem from either of the characters' points of view.

SPAG

Please give the children time to research and practise the new spellings-listed on the overview.

All of these spellings are available for practising on Spelling shed too.


Spelling shed test – Thursday 7th May at 3pm and at 3:30pm (to try and support with any technical issues!) so there may be 2 codes.

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Science

Moon diary project.

This will begin on Monday 4th May and last 4 weeks (until 31st May)

Each day/night (starting today!) I would like the children to observe the moon and record its appearance. So ideally - by the time the project finishes - they will have recorded the moon's appearance 28 times (although as we know this might not be so easy e.g. on cloudy nights or if it is below the horizon — but this is an important learning point for the children). They can present this however they wish! This may be through photographs, drawing, painting, stamping, biscuits - think about what could represent the moon each day.

Art

VE day bunting. It would be lovely to see some fantastic bunting decorating your houses and I'd love to see what the children can create in order to help celebrate's Friday's 75th anniversary celebrations. Talk to your children about what they can remember about WW2 and our topic earlier this year. I'd love to hear some of their memories from our VE day party at the village hall as well!
