"The beginning of the world"

Core Learning of This Unit:

- Understand the beliefs that Christians and Jews have regarding how the world began
- Be able to re-tell the Creation Story in detail – explaining each part in detail
- Reflect on the beliefs children have and how these compare to others.
- Look at things happening in the world today and whether this makes people happy or sad.
- Describe ways the world could be improved.

Prior Learning:

- Children understand the word 'God' and that it is something invisible.
- Children recognise that there are different faiths
- Children understand that sometimes people believe different things to them.
- Children understand and know that Christians have a Holy Book called 'The Bible'.
