Subject: R.E (Who is Jewish and what do they believe??) Year Group: 3 Term: Spring

Core Learning of This Unit:

Children will:

- Talk about how the mezuzah in the home reminds Jewish people about God
- Talk about how Shabbat is a special day of the week for Jewish people, and give some examples of what they might do to celebrate Shabbat
- Re-tell a story that shows what Jewish people at the festival of Chanukah might think about God, suggesting what it means
- Make links between some Jewish teachings and how Jewish people live.
- Express their own ideas about the value of times of reflection, thanksgiving, praise and remembrance, in the light of their learning about why Jewish people choose to celebrate in these ways.

Children will visit a Jewish temple as their place of worship trip.

Prior Learning:

From KS1: Children will have learnt about festivals and celebrations from different religions.

Key Vocabulary:

- Menorah – a sacred candelabrum with seven branches
- Hanukkah – A Jewish festival which takes place in December
- Star of David – the main Jewish symbol, named after the Jewish King David
- Torah – the Jewish holy book, written in Hebrew
- Synagogue – the Jewish place of worship
- Passover – A Jewish holiday that celebrates the escapes of Ancient Hebrews from Egypt
- Shofar – a ram's-horn trumpet used in religious ceremonies
- Mezuzah – a parchment inscribed with texts and attached in a case to the doorpost of a Jewish house
- Kippah – a head covering, also known as a skullcap
- Rabbi – Jewish religious leader
- Ten Commandments – the rules God gave to Jews to live their lives by.
