Subject: RE Year Group: 3 Term: Summer 1  
"Why do some people think life is a journey?"

### Core Learning of This Unit:

- Explore and use the religious metaphor of life as a journey. What are the milestones on this journey
- Consider the value and meaning of ceremonies which mark milestones in life, particularly those associated with growing up and taking responsibility within a faith community
- Explore the symbols and rituals used at ceremonies, and the promises made. Do non-religious people e.g. Humanists mark these moments?
- What meaning do these ceremonies have to the individual, their family and their communities?
- Think about the symbolism, meaning and value of ceremonies that mark the commitment of a loving relationship between two people: compare marriage ceremonies and commitments in two religious traditions. What promises are made?
- Explore some basic ideas about what Christians, Hindus and Jewish people believe about life after death; how do they mark the end of life?

### Prior Learning:

From KS1: Children will have learnt about Islam and Christianity in detail including the key festivals celebrated

Children will know about key religious celebrations including some personal experiences.

Children will know about marriage and what happens in an Islamic and Christian wedding

All children will have visited a mosque.
