Subject: RE Year Group: 6 Term: Autumn 2 "What is so special about marriage?"

Core Learning of This Unit:

- Consider the concepts of relationship and commitment
- Consider a diverse range of views on the question, 'How can two people show commitment to one another?'
- Look at and study marriage ceremonies and where this sits in relation to some key events in the lives of believers
- Think about their own experiences and views in relation to questions of how they show commitment and form relationships.
- Look at how modern day relationships involve same sex marriages and the change in the laws surrounding this

Prior Learning:

From KS1: Children will have learnt about Islam and Christianity in detail including the key festivals celebrated

Children will have studied and will have knowledge of at least 5 major world religions inc. marriage ceremonies in these.

Children will have looked at marriage in KS1 and will understand ceremonies in the Christian church

All children will have visited a mosque, a church, a cathedral, a gurdwara, a temple and a synagogue before Year 6
