Subject: RE Year Group: 6 Term: Summer 2 "Why do some people believe God exists?"

Core Learning of This Unit:

- Find out about how many people in the world and in the local area believe in God
- Explore some reasons why people do or do not believe in God. Consider some of the main reasons for this.
- Consider ways in which Christians read the Genesis account of creation. Explore why some Christians read it literally.

Prior Learning:

From KS1: Children will have learnt about Islam and Christianity in detail including the key festivals celebrated

Children will have studied and will have knowledge of at least 5 major world religions

All children will have visited a mosque, a church, a cathedral, a gurdwara, a temple and a synagogue before Year 6
