Core Learning of This Unit:

- Re-cap of Days of the Week and Months of the Year
 - -Understand that Spanish is spoken in many countries throughout the world.
 - -Use the internet to research climate.
 - -Choose a country for the holiday and select dates.
 - -Make predictions about meaning based on existing knowledge.
 - -Write short sentences, using a model.
- Re-cap of phrases from Y4/5 (Hay, vivo en)
 - -Match sound to individual word in a list of sentences.
 - -Work out how to pronounce unknown words.
 - -Identify the sounds of some letters of the alphabet.
