Subject: D&T Year Group: 4 Term: Summer

Core Learning of This Unit:

The children will create a **product linked to interior design (e.g. Pillow/cushion)** as part of their **Grand designs theme.** As part of this, pupils should be able Measure, mark out, cut and shape a range of materials, using appropriate tools, equipment and techniques; join and combine materials and components accurately in temporary and permanent ways; sew using a range of different stitches, weave and knit; measure, tape or pin, cut and join fabric with some accuracy and use simple graphical communication techniques (e.g. to design their product initially and collate ideas)

They will generate ideas, considering the purposes for which they are designing; make labelled drawings from different views showing specific features (e.g. embellishments), develop a clear idea of what has to be done, planning how to use materials, equipment and processes, and suggesting alternative methods of making, if the first attempts fail; evaluate products and identify criteria that can be used for their own designs; they will evaluate their work both during and at the end of the assignment; evaluate their products carrying out appropriate tests.
