# Critical Worker Care

Safety remains our utmost priority during the pandemic and demand for places in school for children of Critical Workers is high. To prevent transmission of the virus, the safest place for the children to be is at home. Of course, we want to support Critical Workers in their roles and provide places in school for vulnerable children. However I must prioritise the safety of the children and staff in school as well as for the whole community and we must aim to keep our group sizes as small as we can. We are doing our utmost to support all the children at home with remote learning as well as to maintain and protect our Critical Worker and Vulnerable children service. I know that you will only use this service for the sessions where it is absolutely needed and there no other option. I do thank you for your support in this.

Thank you for booking wraparound care by lunchtime on Friday for the week ahead where possible so that we can safely plan for these numbers.

Please could I also reiterate the paramount importance of not sending children into school where they have symptoms of Covid-19. Our stance at Jerry Clay is to err on the side of caution as there are a range of symptoms now linked with the virus and keep children at home if unwell in order to protect the Critical Worker service.





# Primary School Staff Covid Testing

The Department of Education has recently started a programme of asymptomatic COVID-19 testing in primary schools. Along with other protective measures we are taking, testing will allow us to take further measures to help staff members to work in as safe an environment as possible and to keep the community safe.

# Reading Book Exchange

Next week we are going to have Reading Books available at school for children to come and choose their next reading book. These books will be inside the Main Entrance of school due to the damp, wet weather. Under each table is a box for you to put used reading books in from home so that they can be isolated. **Books can be collected between 9am-4pm on your child's allocated day.** 

To be as safe as possible we have allocated certain days to each class to avoid large numbers of families coming to school at the same time. The timetable for this collection is as follows:

Monday - Reception & Year 1 Tuesday - Year 2 & Year 3 Wednesday - Year 4 Thursday - Year 5 & 6

When entering the school premises please make sure that face coverings are worn at all times. Please can we ask that social distancing rules are adhered to at all times should you see any other families at school.




