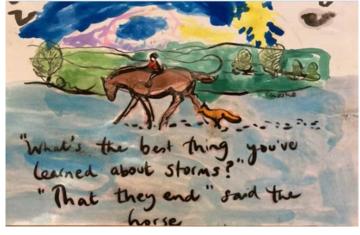


Jerry Clay Academy Newsletter

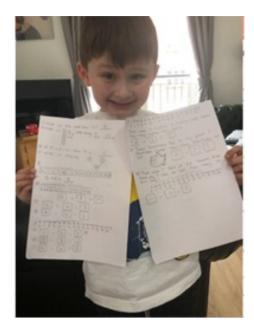
