WRAP AROUND CARE

Run by academy staff and offering a range of indoor and outdoor activities including games, crafts, table tennis, pool and outdoor play.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA



Year 1 have continued to get lots of inspiration from our core text: Leaf. We are striving to use vocabulary and ideas from the story in order to plan our own stories in Literacy. In Art, we have been developing our printmaking skills so that we can use this skill to create our front cover of our very own stories, inspired by the front cover of Leaf.

In Geography we have learned more about hot and cold places around

the world, including the equator and the poles; we packed our suitcases carefully

thinking about what we might take if we visited!

Our Maths learning has been focussed on identifying odd and even numbers, spotting patterns in our number square and number lines and using numicon to help.

Wow! What a busy two weeks of amazing learning we have had! Year 2 have impressed us with their inquisitiveness and enthusiasm to learning. In Literacy, we have begun writing our own versions of 'Grandma Bird' by Benji Davies. We started by using our story telling

to learn the story. Scan the QR code to watch our super story telling! Now, we are using the structure to rewrite our own version. We have been striving to use expanded noun phrases, alliteration and similes!


In Maths, we have completed our learning on measuring length and height and have started to explore position and direction. We created map of the Yorkshire Wildlife Park to help us describe left, right, up and down to give clear directions.

This week, we were also lucky enough to attend a virtual workshop at Wakefield Cathedral. We had a fantastic time following up our R.E learning about Christians to explore special places of worship!

Year 3

Year 3 have shown brilliant perseverance in their learning this week. We are glad to be back together again, to continue the hard work we produced in isolation.

In Literacy this week the children have shown fantastic recall of our diary entry features and have used their detailed plans from home learning to support their hot writes.

In Maths, we have been recapping our understanding of adding and subtracting different lengths. We corroborated this knowledge with an enriched outdoor learning session, where the children became maths code breakers. They had to use what they had learnt to answers a variety of questions to reveal a clue.



Across our topic of 'The Great Outdoors' the children have shown off their creativity, using resources from the outdoors such as leaves and flowers to practise colourful printing techniques as well as painting their collage backgrounds in Art. Year 4

Year 4 have had an excellent few weeks where they have demonstrated fantastic inquisitiveness and risk taking when developing their knowledge about the industrial revolution. They have been enthralled in new learning which was also benefited by our outdoor learning day we participated within last week. This has resulted in the children producing some excellent diary entries set within the industrial revolution describing the day that they saw the steam

In maths, the children have demonstrated excellent perseverance when developing their knowledge of decimals. They worked well in partners to understand how to show decimals and fractions on a number line where they are starting to apply their previous knowledge to near learning.

Year 5

Year 5 had a great day spent outdoors with Eden's Forest. They learnt about Space, consolidating their learning about planets. One of the key things from the day was being able to share some of the facts that they learnt about – did you know that Saturn is 1.433 million miles away from the sun?

In Literacy, we have completed our adventure stories based on 'The Jamie Drake Equation' and are now starting

to write an explanation text using our knowledge. In Maths, we are now learning about decimals.

Year 6

Year 6 have had another fantastic two weeks full of so much high quality learning and outcomes! It has been brilliant to meet with you all via Teams and share all of the wonderful achievements of your children!

In Literacy and Drama, we have been using 'The Tempest' as inspiration to write character descriptions of Caliban and Prospero and create different scenes.



During Maths, we have started to learn about statics and data and how to collect and interpret this. We started with line graphs and will be learning about 'the mean' next week.



In Wise Time, we have created stories based on 'The Colour monster' to explore our own worries and experiences. We think younger children will love these!

Our JLT have been working hard on getting Worry Buddies up and running – they are currently preparing further training so that we can continue to make Jerry Clay a happy place to be!
