**Ongoing Covid Control Measures in school and arrangements for upcoming events -**We have all been enjoying the opening up of some aspects of society as part of the easing of lockdown however I just wanted to make you fully aware of current government restrictions last issued to schools on May 24th. *"You must do everything possible to minimise contacts and mixing while delivering a broad and balanced curriculum".* In our small classrooms, if we

have a positive case in a class bubble, all the children in that class are required to self isolate. We really want to protect the children's learning in school and we thankyou for your vigilance in not sending children to school if they have symptoms of Covid 19. We are continuing to keep children and staff in different bubbles, distanced so that any cases do not impact on more children. We await further guidance on what future easing of restrictions might be from the government and how that will impact on schools.

### **Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA**

### Year 1

Year 1 have had a very productive and exciting couple of weeks! We absolutely loved Creative Arts week where we expressed our emotions through dance, drama and art and considered the power of connecting together as a team. We are looking forward to sharing our sculpture with you in a couple of weeks at our sculpture park!

This week we have launched our new core text: The Jungle book! Alongside this we will be learning all about incredible jungle creatures, jungles around the world and where they are located. We found out that we will be having a jungle party at the end of the theme! The children have listened beautifully to the story and created lovely story maps to show their understanding of this during Literacy.



In Maths we have been learning about equal and unequal groups, we have created groups of 2 and 5 in order to build up our skills in grouping. We are applying our excellent counting in 2s and 5s to help with this!



### Year 2

Wow! Another amazing week in Year 2 and the weeks are flying by! Year 2 have been striving so high in all their learning and enjoying their last half term.

In Literacy, we have been exploring our new story focus 'Cyril the lonely cloud' for our them 'What's the weather'. We used our active reading skills to explore the front cover and make predictions about the story. We also created beautiful story maps to help us remember the story.

In Maths, we have spent the week applying all our learning from September to help us to solve lots of word problems. It has been challenging to review and remember all our learning and solve 2 step problems.

In D.T, we are continuing our textiles project inspired by 'Grandma Bird'. We cut out all our different layers of fabric to match our designs, ready to sew on to our patches next week.



### Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

### Year 3

Year 3 have made a brilliant start back to their learning after the half term. We have been so impressed by their attitudes and enthusiasm.

In maths, we have been continuing our super work on fractions. The children consistently showcase their mathematical vocabulary, proving just how much hard work they are putting into each lesson. We have just begun looking at tenths, specifically on how we can show these as decimals and counting as far as we possibly can with fractions!

In literacy the children are still loving our core text of Charlotte's Web. The children have been taking it in turns to read parts of the chapter aloud to increase their confidence. We have been spotting key features of a newspaper report and understanding what makes a good headline.



In our topic lessons we are continuing to progress our knowledge on farming. We had a phenomenal lesson on how farming has developed over the years, specifically looking at the evolution of ploughing and milking cows. The children showed lots of inquisitiveness looking through old photographs and fantastic listening skills as we explored challenging graphs/statistics on farming.

### Year 4

Year 4 have had an excellent week back! In Maths, we have been looking at developing our understanding of money and applying this to different problems and situations. The children thoroughly enjoyed going to 'Jerry Clay Stores' and using their knowledge to buy and sell groceries to other children.

In Literacy, we have started to use the idea of Drag-



ons Den to excite children into thinking about how we can write a persuasive argument to pitch an idea to the Dragons. In DT, the children have continued to build and adapt their trains where they have de-



signed these using different colours and patterns.

Finally, in Science, the children have continued to expand on their knowledge of sound and how this travels where they applied their knowledge of vibrations to the telephone and other devices before making some telephones of their own.

### Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

### Year 5

Year 5 have impressed us so much in their learning over the past few weeks. Creative Arts Week was extremely busy and the children worked so hard to create their final pieces which they cannot wait for you all to see!

As well as the creations for the gallery, Year 5 completed their sewing pieces, inspired by space artist, Peter Thorpe. This was a result of two afternoons of determination, perseverance and patience!

This week, Year 5 have enjoyed learning about the first moon landing and have written a brilliant newspaper report to tell the story. In Maths, Year 5 have moved onto learning more in-depth about decimals, using the place value skills they already have.



### Year 6

Year 6 have had a great first week back! In Literacy, we have been working on developing higher quality vocabulary and sentences through our suspense story, 'Alma'. During Maths lessons, we have been updating our knowledge on angles and shapes and revising other topics that we have studied this year.

In Geography, we have started to learn about Trade and what product are imported and exported in an out of the United Kingdom.

Today, each Year 6 child received their own copy of Go Big: The Secondary School Survival Guide We will be using this in school to support our transition Wise Time sessions.
