### Covid public health advice

As you will be aware, there has been a significant rise in Covid cases in the local area amongst younger age groups. Public health are advising that the vaccination programme remains the main way for us to move as a community towards a more normal way of life with fewer restrictions. Unfortunately there is currently increasing disruption to education in the

local area due to bubble closures and children self-isolating. At Jerry Clay, we really want to do whatever we can to keep our children in school where their learning is progressing so well. Therefore, please can I pass on the most recent Covid advice so that we can all work together to protect this.

- Please continue to distance and wear a face mask on the school site.
- Please be cautious if your child or any member of your household has symptoms of Covid-19 and do not send them to school. Common symptoms now include cold symptoms, sore throats, muscle aches, vomiting and diarrhoea. I would encourage a PCR test for any of these symptoms due to the rapid rise locally.
- Close contacts of people who have tested positive can now access PCR tests whether or not they have symptoms.
- Wakefield district today began a programme of testing asking all resident to take a PCR test. This is to ensure Wakefield is in the best possible position when further lockdown restrictions are eased. If I do receive any further details of this, I will pass it on.

### Grab a jab weekend

With cases of the Delta variant increasing in West Yorkshire, it's more important than ever that people get both doses of their vaccine.

The NHS is holding a national Grab a Jab weekend from Friday 25th July to Monday 28th July to make it as easy as possible for people to get their first or second dose of their vaccine.

The following 'Walk-in' clinics will be held this weekend for anyone aged 18 or over.

### **Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA**

### Year 1

Year 1 have had an exciting couple of weeks! As a class, we have enjoyed lots of exciting events; we absolutely loved Sports Day last week, we also explored our JCA Sculpture park together as a class and yesterday, we had a special virtual visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park! We are so lucky!

In Literacy, we have been comparing different versions of The Jungle Book and exploring exciting vocabulary from it! We have started to explore the jungle setting, and created music to represent the incredible creatures that live there! In Geography, we



have written factual posters all about where jungles are and what animals can be found there.



During Maths, we have been building up our knowledge of grouping. This week we have been focussing on doubles, and representing these in different ways including as addition sums. We were super at spotting the patterns in the answers!

In Design and Technology, we have investigated different hammock designs as we are striving to create a hammock for Mowgli in the jungle. We have created some inspired designs so far!

### Year 2

Another fabulous 2 weeks have passed in Year 2 and we just become more proud and inspired by the children. We are so impressed by their efforts to strive high in preparation for Year 3!

In Literacy, we have begun a new story 'Cyril the lonely cloud' and we are beginning to create our own shape poems. We have looked at lots of examples and we enjoyed spotting rhyming words in existing poems and stories. This week we have been developing exciting vocabulary to use in our own poems.

In Maths, we have started our new unit on 'time'. It was really useful to apply our knowledge of fractions to help us to understand telling the time at o'clock and half past the





hour. We created our own clocks in the outdoor area to show different times.

Year 2 also had an amazing first sports day with KS2! They demonstrated fantastic teamwork, sportsmanship and made everyone incredibly proud. We have uploaded the videos of each race onto seesaw to share with you!

### **Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA**

### Year 3

Year 3 have had a really busy couple of weeks! They worked so hard in our PE lessons in the lead up to sports day, and this hard work was clear to see on the day. They also spent time weeding the gardening beds ready for our Creative Arts structure to be put up. Overall, showing superb dedication and teamwork.

In maths, we have been finding fractions of amounts and really challenging ourselves to apply this knowledge to trickier worded questions. They have been able to utilise all of their learning on fractions to begin to spot patterns and equivalent fractions.

In Literacy, we have been putting the final pieces of our newspaper report together on Charlotte's Web. We looked at all of the brilliant work and examples from our books, to help us when we began forming our plan.

Year 3 loved our DT lesson this week on exploring seasonal vegetables and fruit. We gathered our understanding of the term 'seasonality' and discussed what fruit and vegetables would fall into our four seasons. Our favourite part had to be when we were finally able to taste test some of the fruit and vegetables that had been brought in.





### Year 4

Year 4 have been working hard in their maths to understand angles and turns and apply this to a variety of different questions. They have been able to utilise their previous knowledge of fractions when discussing and moving using turns.

In Literacy, we have started to look at Dragons Den where the children have started to understand what a pitch is before beginning to decide what they will say and how they will persuade the Dragons to invest.

In Science, the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about electricity where they have shown excellent inquisitiveness to ask and answer questions linked to the dangers of electricity. They showcased a real mature and in-depth understanding of the reasoning of why and how we can be careful in our homes.



### Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

### Year 5

Year 5 are so passionate about the DT project they have started! They have used their design brief to create a moving space vehicle and have already researched to start their designs – we can't wait to see the final outcome. As well as this, Year 5 have learnt about the different layers of the Earth and can 'speak like an expert' on this!

In Literacy, Year 5 have really been focusing on sentence structures and applying their knowledge of different sentence clauses; they have been working on using these skills in mystery stories.

In Maths, they have continued their learning on decimals and have applied their calculation methods to be able to add and subtract numbers to different decimal places.





### Year 6

Year 6 have had a fantastic couple of weeks. We have been writing some horror genre stories based around our stimulus, 'Alma'. The children have had fun playing with language and grammar to scare their readers and keep them in suspense! We have also been writing letters to our future selves and are going to keep these as our own mini time capsule/keepsake to look back on.

In Maths, we have been continuing revision of shape and time. We have also been learning how to read a bus and class timetable in preparation for secondary school. We have also discussed how we can increase our independence.

On Thursday, we had our virtual R.E trip with Brother Marc from Mirfield Community of the Resurrection. This was a fantastic question and answer session!

Next week is our FunFest Week – we are very much looking forward to all the exciting activities we have planned!

- Reduced fees are available for a second or third child from the same family attending after school club. The reduced fees from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020 are: £6.50 (collect up to 5.15pm) / £8.50 (collect by 6pm).
