Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA



Year 1

Year 1 enjoyed their first ever school visit on Tuesday 9th November! We had a fantastic walk up to St Anne's church. Words cannot describe just how proud we were of the children; they were amazing! Whilst we were there, Father Jonathon showed us all the special objects in the church.

During Literacy, Year 1 have used clues to predict details about their new core text: The Dragon Machine. We enjoyed a dragon hunt outside and have been using prepositions to describe dragons on maps of the places in our book. In Geography, we have been learning about a compass and how they give specific directions. We have put com-

passes onto our own maps.

During Maths, we have looked at lots of different ways and vocabulary to describe addition sums, working practically and with abstract numbers and symbols to represent these. We are now moving onto subtraction.

We went on a lovely Autumn walk in Science to discover different clues of Autumn, with the children using the iPad to take photos of different things that they spotted.

Year 2

Wow! What a busy start to the half term we have had in Year 2! One of our favourite memories was our outdoor learning day! We spent the day exploring the history of mining and the Victorian Era. We reflected on all our learning of mining so far and enjoyed making memories with hot chocolate too!

In Literacy, we have started creating our own fact file. Last week, we focussed on subtitles and how to organise our sentences into paragraphs. This week we have started writing our fact files on mining jobs. We have created an amazing introduction paragraph with fantastic sentence openers, questions and conjunctions.



In Maths, we have been reviewing the different methods we now know to be able to add and subtract numbers up to 100! We also learnt how to use related facts to help us use smaller numbers to add and subtract larger numbers.

In Art, we have completed our final art piece for our mining theme. We used pastels to blend our foreground miner. We have now started our DT project for this half term and we are looking forward to designing and making our own miners snap tin pasties.



Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 3



We have been so unbelievably proud of the children in their maths over the last couple of weeks! They have been continually striving to apply column addition and subtraction to worded problems and have been checking for marvellous mistakes.

In Literacy, Year 3 have been working really hard to master each feature of a diary entry. They have been using the text of 'Stone Age Boy' to create detailed character descriptions and setting descriptions, with a real focus on expanded noun phrases.

In History, the children have identified Stone Age inventions and explained which of them is the most important. Finally, in Science, the children have enjoyed learning all about different types of skeletons. We have sorted different x-rays of animals into vertebrates and invertebrates and then researched information on endoskeletons, exoskeletons, and hydrostatic skeletons

Year 4

Year 4 have had a really busy couple of weeks where the children have been working really hard in their maths to apply their knowledge of addition and subtraction to a range of multi-step word problems and complex number sentences. In Literacy, year 4 have started looking at the key features in an informal letter where they have started to look at who the Anglo-Saxons were in History to understand who they might be writing their letter to and the reasons for asking them to move to Britain.

In Art, the children have used Plaster of Paris to make their Pop Art work 3D. From this they have painted these and added extra details so that the writing looks like it could jump off the page at any moment. Finally, in science, the children have enjoyed learning all about different types of animals and classifying them in different ways. They have started to use Venn diagrams and branching diagrams when classifying and grouping organisms differently.



Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have completed their art project; creating a clay tile using sculpting techniques – you can see some of the fantastic outcomes below. As well as this, we have continued our learning about The Blitz and can name some of the cities most affected and say why these cities were bombed based on their location. We have also written a newspaper article based on the bombings in Coventry during The War.

In Maths, we have completed our learning about statistics and we are confident to present and interpret data in different ways.



Year 6

Year 6 have had another brilliant fortnight – full of striving! In Maths, we have been continuing to learn about fractions. We have simplified, converted, added, subtracted, multiplied and divided these. Please encourage your child to revise these (using their revision books) over the year.

In Literacy, we have produced detailed historical accounts of Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb.

We would also like to thank all of our Junior Leadership Team who helped prepare displays, books and classrooms to showcase their hard work, ready for our Open Morning. Junior Leaders who led tours were so clear and confident – we are so proud of them! Well done and thank you!
