Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1


Year 1 have had a busy couple of weeks of learning, they have been really striving to be the best in all that they do and we are so proud!

In Literacy, we have completed our amazing dragon maps and shown the dragons around. We have completed some superb writing to describe it, applying our Geographical language and directions to make this really spectacular and detailed!

In Maths we have been learning all about subtraction, including different methods such as: crossing out pictures and counting back on a number line. We have also been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Science, we learnt about the story of King Midas which helped us to

consider the different good things and bad things about materials. We are hard at work with our D&T project, designing our dragon machines whilst thinking carefully about the materials we would like to use when we make them!



Year 2


Year two have had a brilliant two weeks and are beginning to enjoy the festive period! We have started to rehearse our Nativity 'This is Bethlehem' with Year One and we cannot wait to share it with you!

In Literacy, we have been striving to write our own non-chronological report about coal mining. We have enjoyed challenging ourselves to organise our sentences into paragraphs and write in an informative style.

In Maths, we have continued our learning on addition and subtraction. Our

new challenge is column addition! We have now become confident in partitioning our tens and ones to add two-digit numbers to 100! In our morning challenge, we have also been focussing on our 2,5,10 and 3 times tables.

In History and Geography, we have continued our learning on coal mining. We discovered where coal mines were located around the UK and created a timeline of key events in mining history.

Year 3

Year 3 continue to keep striving and are spreading some extra Christmas magic across their learning.

In Maths, we have shown phenomenal perseverance with our multiplication and division learning. The children have been increasing their fluency on the 3- and 4-times tables and we have carried out a range of activities to showcase our knowledge in class. We have also had an astounding number of Diamond Dash passes!

For Literacy, we have published our recount writing and have just started exploring our new core text of 'The Secrets of Stonehenge.' The children have been learning in-depth on how Stonehenge was built

and were able to sequence events from the story with super understanding.

Our learning on the Stone Age has moved onto the Bronze Age in History this week. We have gathered lots of facts and begun to understand why bronze was used instead of stone for tools and weapons. In RE, we have looked at the festival of Passover where we posed some lovely questions on the story of Moses and how this links into the Jewish festival.



Year 4



Another fantastic couple of weeks in year 4! The children have been thoroughly engaged in all our learning this week, particularly in History where we have been learning all about who the Anglo-Saxons were and what life in this time period would be like. From this, the children have shared their opinions on if they would have liked to have been within this time period and explained why or why not. This understanding has also been replicated in their literacy where they have produced some excellent persuasive letters which they have wrote to a family member to encourage them to wish to make the journey to Britain.

Finally, in Maths, we have been looking at finding the perimeter of a shape. The children really enjoyed drawing their own shapes and solving the perimeter practically before utilising this knowledge to find the perimeter of rectangles and rectilinear shapes.




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
Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 5

Yet another fantastic couple of weeks in Year 5. As we come to the end of our theme about World War 2, we have been learning about some of the key battles that defined the outcome of The War. In addition to this, in Literacy, we have been building up to writing our own stories about the issues that animals had in The War using 'The Emergency Zoo' as inspiration.

In Maths we have been working on our problem solving skills with multiplication and division. We have finished learning about Materials in Science and have completed the retrieval clocks that you can see in the pictures.





Year 6

Year 6 have been working so incredibly hard in all areas of the curriculum. In Literacy, we have been refining our grammar skills and writing newspaper reports based on events in our core text, 'Secrets of a Sun King.' We have thoroughly enjoyed our core text 'Secrets of a Sun King' and will now be reading 'A Christmas Carol' in the lead up to Christmas.

In Maths, we have continued to deepen our understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages – we will be continuing this for the next fortnight. Y6 have now learnt all of the arithmetic methods and have brought home a purple guide to all of these methods – please use these to support revision throughout the year.

During Geography, we have been learning about rivers and flooding. Do you know how dams work and some of their advantages and disadvantages? We have also designed and created Christmas Tree decorations and hung these on our JCA tree.
