As you know as a school we continue to focus on excellent attendance (where appropriate). Every day in school matters and while, unfortunately, we continue to be impacted by absence from Covid-19, it is paramount that we work together to ensure that the children are in school on time every day they are well. This will allow us to ensure gaps in learning are filled and the children stay on track and thrive in their learning.

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1

Year 1 have had a wonderful few weeks welcoming Paddington into life at Jerry Clay in Wrenthorpe. We have also enjoyed exploring Paddington's home country of Peru – this has been very interesting. We used an atlas to find that Peru is in the continent of South America, and used photos to look at images of

Peru. It really did surprise us, all of the colours, foods and jobs in Peru.





We are busy in Literacy writing our letters to Aunt Lucy. Our main focus is striving high with our superstar words and place names. The children are really enjoying the challenge!

In Maths, we have been focusing on comparing and ordering objects and numbers between 1 and 20. We enjoyed completing this practically as well as with abstract numbers, using the vocabulary of greatest, smallest, least, most.

In Year two, we are continuing to strive higher in our learning and we are enjoying the challenge! In Maths, we have started our new unit on multiplication. We have used a variety of resources in our learning to help us represent multiplication in different ways. Inside and outside, we have used groups and now arrays to help us solve multiplication problems.

In Literacy, we have loved reading our core text 'Pretty Salma'. This week, we have started planning and mapping out our own characters and structure so that we can write our own version of 'Pretty Salma'.

In DT, we have been using our Art skills to review and recap our primary and secondary colours. Then, we could use these to help us evaluate existing products for our DT project. In DT, we are beginning to design and make an African tribal t-shirt called an 'Ghana Batakari'.

Year 3


What a fantastic week in Year 3! We have really been striving with our presentation across subjects and our enthusiasm and passion has really shone through in our work.

In Maths, we have been focusing on dividing through the partitioning model. Although we have found this really challenging, we have persevered using concrete models and feel much more confident.

In Literacy, we have been incredibly proud of Year 3 for the fantastic play scripts they have written! These are now complete and the children are looking forward to performing them in groups next week.



In Science, we have been continuing to look at magnets and focused this week on magnetic and non-magnetic



materials. The children loved exploring which materials they could pick up with the magnets. In Geography, we have done some lovely work on human and physical characteristics of Wakefield. We have used our own knowledge of Wakefield to name key landmarks and compare them.

Year 4

Year 4 have been working extremely well over the last couple of weeks, they have used a variety of poetry features along with including their humour into producing a shape poem that links to an Amazon rainforest animal. In Maths, we have also been continuing to develop our times table knowledge through utilsing our knowledge when using

the bus stop method to solve division problems.





In Art, we have developed our knowledge of colour using a colour wheel to consider how we can make secondary and tertiary colours. We have also developed our knowledge of warm and cool colours and applied this when developing pictures linked to the Amazon rainforest. Finally, in Geography, we have been locating different rainforests across the world, considering climate and identify what different layers of the rainforest.

Year 5 have again been working so hard. In Literacy, they have written their own explanation texts and have 'produced' them in the style of David Attenborough! In Maths, Year 5 have started to learn about multiplication and division. They have been able to retrieve key facts and have learnt multiplications up to 3d x 2d.

In our theme, Year 5 have been able to retrieve key geographical facts about the World and have now learnt about lines of latitude and longi-


tude – did you know that the Equator only passes through 13 countries?!
