As you know as a school we continue to focus on excellent attendance (where appropriate). Every day in school matters. Learning is structured carefully in sequences with new knowledge and skills taught, consolidated and practised every day. It is paramount that we work together to ensure that the children are in school on time every day they are well. This will allow us to ensure gaps in learning are filled and the children stay on track and thrive in their learning.



8:50 am - Doors open. All classes are learning from the very start with a morning learning challenge in a core area of the curriculum such as maths or reading.
