






## World Down Syndrome Day 21st March 2022

We would like to celebrate World Down Syndrome Day on **Monday 21st of March** by coming to school wearing colourful socks!



People with Down Syndrome have an extra chromosome (they have 3 copies of chromosome 21 - hence 21/3, 21st March!) and to raise awareness and support World Down Syndrome day the "Lots of Socks" campaign is a worldwide campaign run by Down Syndrome International. Why Lots of Socks?

This is a picture of chromosomes which some say look a little bit like pairs of socks. Sometimes people have an extra 'sock' or chromosome and a person with Down syndrome has an extra copy of chromosome 21 as you can see in the picture. That's ok – it just means that some things are a little harder for them. They are a little different but different is ok. People with Down syndrome

learn, laugh, love, live and, just like the rest of us, sometimes also get cross, sad, dislike things, get uncomfortable being stared at and just want to join in with everyone else. Where children with Down syndrome and other disabilities are given opportunities to join in, all children benefit from this and environments of friendship, acceptance, respect for everyone and high expectations are created.



Inclusive environments also help to prepare all today's children for life as tomorrow's adults, enabling adults with Down Syndrome to live, work and join-in, with confidence and independence, fully included in society alongside their friends and peers.

## **Excellent Attendance!**



As you know as a school we continue to focus on excellent attendance (where appropriate). Every day in school matters. Learning is structured carefully in sequences with new knowledge and skills taught, consolidated and practised every day. ## Year 1

Year 1 celebrated the end of their Paddington learning with a fantastic workshop at the end of last half term. We were delighted to share our learning with parents and grandparents - thank you to everyone that was able to attend!

We have started this half term with a very busy week thinking about friendships in PSHCE and Literacy, where we have been thinking about the perfect ingredients to make a good friend. We loved creating a friendship web to show how we are all connected in Year 1. In Science, we investigated the weather forecast for Wrenthorpe for this week and created our own weather chart using symbols.





World Book Day was brilliant; we enjoyed listening to stories, creating role play, swapping books and making up our own fairytale ideas!

#### Year 3


What a fantastic start we have had back after the half term! Year 3 have come back with brilliant attitudes and are continuing to showcase their love for learning.

In Literacy, we have begun learning about our new text type 'adventure stories.' We have been fantastic detectives when identifying the key features of the text type and are looking at ways we can include these in our own writing.

In Maths, we are concluding our learning on money. This

has been a really challenging concept and the children have shown their phenomenal resilience when subtracting

money and finding change.

In Maths, the children have been developing their knowledge surrounding fractions where they have started to apply this knowledge along with their knowledge of multiplying and dividing to find equivalent fractions.





Finally, as it was World Book Day, Year 4 thoroughly enjoyed dressing up for this. They really enjoyed creating an alternative title for the book 'The Invisible' and becoming illustrators to design a different front cover that would entice the reader to read the book.
