
Dear Parents,

Tiddler

On Monday we shared The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch story and we learnt key phrases from Mr Grinling such as 'Lackaday Lackaday' and 'Clear off you varmints!'. We have also been learning to use key vocabulary such as 'devoured' and 'industrious'.

During the week, we have been busy preparing Mr Grinling's lunch and sending it down zip lines created from rope. We have been inventing pulley systems and creative ways to distribute the food to our friends avoiding the pesky seagulls. Children have also been building lighthouses, harbours and cottages in the construction and sand areas of provision. On Wednesday, we created delicious mud sea food recipes for Mr Grinling's lunch. On Thursday morning, the children went for a walk around the School grounds. We used our directional and positional knowledge to draw arrows on a map to show where we had travelled. Such great attention to detail! In PE, we





learnt how to roll our bodies

in different ways including a log roll, straddle roll and a tucked roll. The children also enjoyed playing the shape game afterwards.

Maths

In Maths, we are learning all about directions so that Mr Grinling can find his way home from the lighthouse. The children have ben using up/forwards, down/backwards and left/right/across to describe Mr Grinling's journey. We practised moving in different directions with our partner and reading and drawing maps. The children described their journey using a wooden boat and directional language.
