Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA





Year 1

Year 1 have enjoyed learning about measures in Maths. Whilst the weather was lovely last week, we enjoyed exploring our outdoor area to measure the length and height of different objects. This week we have started to look at weight and mass, using the language of heavier and lighter.

We have enjoyed looking into different maps of Wrenthorpe in Geography, and in Wise Time we have been discussing responsibility.

In Literacy, we have been striving to write their play scripts and think carefully about their punctuation and language choices, these are almost ready to be read next week and created into puppet shows!

In Design and Technology, we have been busy designing and starting to make their bluebird puppets. First they created their own templates, then carefully used this to draw around the felt pieces for the top of our stick puppets.

Year 2

Year 2 have continued their learning on Africa and have enjoyed researching Nelson Mandela. In History, we have created a timeline of his life and discussed the impact he has had on life today. The children were shocked by the apartheid.

In Literacy, we have been striving to create a recipe for 'How to make a Pretty Salma fruit salad'. We have redrafted and up levelled our writing before publishing them yesterday! We are so proud of the progress we have made and our beautiful handwriting too!



In Maths, we have completed our statistics work and have started exploring 2D and 3D shape. We have developed our mathematical vocabulary to describe the properties of shape to help us identify and name the different shapes.

Last week, we hosted our parent workshop! We wanted to say a huge thank you for supporting and



joining us. The children loved being able to share their learning with you and we were overwhelmed by your attendance! Thank you!

Year 3

Year 3 have been inspired over the past fews by the text Arthur and the Golden Rope to write an adventure story based on a Norse myth. They have practised their use of fronted adverbials to start sentences in different ways and created suspense by describing the setting and using ellipsis.

In Maths, we have continued to learn about converting measurements between metres, centimetres and millimetres and have started to learn to calculate the perimeter and area of shapes.

In DT, we have designed our own Viking shield and are ready to make these. In History we have also used or inquirer skills to find out more about Viking homes and villages ready for our Viking day next week.


Year 3 thoroughly enjoyed their Viking parent workshop and have been coming up with a range of activities they would include in their own Viking workshop.

This week, we have completed our Mock SATs and have


worked so hard this week (and all year)! Please continue to support Year 6 in their homework and revision!
