We will ensure that air is circulating throughout the day and will protect windows from direct sun with the blinds.


The children should wear their shorts or dresses to keep cool. Please make sure the children have sun hats in school and apply sun cream.

Government advice is that by taking these sensible precautions, the children are unlikely to be adversely affected.




Reading newsletter—15th July 2022

Curriculum over the last 2 weeks at JCA

Year 1

Year 1 have been striving as high as ever during the last fortnight, and are showing that they are so ready for their next adventure in Year 2! We have enjoyed reading Conker the Chameleon and sharing our feelings on moving into another classroom.

During our Literacy learning we have been striving to use adjectives and verbs to describe different jungle settings, including plants, animals and the weather. We have been very inspired by a Henri Rosseau artist painting. Also, we have been thinking about how we can use prepositions to describe where things are – we loved our game of animal hide and seek outside yesterday.

In Maths, we have enjoyed using new resources to count, compare and order numbers up to 100 using the vocabulary of tens and ones We have been completing missing numbers on a 100 number square and practicing our times tables for diamond dash.

We hid the jungle animals and then used prepositions to describe where we found them!

In Science we have enjoyed learning about animals and classifying them into mammals, reptiles, fish, amphibians and insects. This week we have been learning about animal diets and whether they are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores.

Year 2

Year two have really enjoyed the last two weeks as we approach the end of our learning journey in Year two! We have enjoyed our transition afternoon in Year three and we have been busy preparing for our end of year celebration assembly! We hope that you can join us!

In Literacy, we have been completing our weather poems, SPAG learning and some character description of Noi from our core text 'Grandma Bird'. In our final week, we will be creating letters to send to Miss Morley, ahead of Year 3, to share our thoughts, feelings and questions.

In Maths, we have been striving extra high! We recently completed our unit on time and now all our children can



read to the time in 5-minute intervals We really persevered to achieve this and we are continuing our practice every day! For our final Maths unit, we have begun our learning on money, recognising pounds and pence and adding to find the total amount.

As we approach our final weeks in Year 2, we have enjoyed completing our learning journey across the curriculum and making our final memories. One our favourite parts of our current learning is our P.E. We have really enjoyed applying our throwing, catching and batting skills into games of rounders. We are so proud of all that Year 2 have achieved this year and we thank you for your continued support!

In Maths, I have been blown away with the phenomenal effort that every single person has been putting into their 'properties of shapes' topic. The children are rising to every challenge that has been set and their knowledge of shape is amazing!

As we reach our final week in Year 3, the children are excited to produce their final art piece! They have been practicing printing techniques and taking real care when carving their designs.

Year 4 have had a fantastic few weeks, they have finished off pretending to be detectives to use the clues and interviews to solve the crime scene. From this, they have developed their computing skills to use 'Word' to produce a newspaper article describing the incident.

Finally in history, we have continued to develop our understanding of the Industrial revolution through considering how canals have been utilised as a mode of transport.
