

Our Campaign for Excellent Attendance!



Excellent attendance in school is essential to ensure every child makes the best possible progress. Every day in school matters. Learning is structured carefully in sequences with new knowledge and skills taught, consolidated and practised every day. It is paramount that we work together to ensure that the children are in school on time every day they are well. This will allow us to ensure gaps in learning are filled and the children stay on track and thrive in their learning.

I am receiving some requests for children to go on holiday during term time and this has such a detrimental affect on the children's learning. Children are missing out on key learning. Our staff and children are working so hard to make sure they feel confident and remain on track with their learn-

ing however any additional absences inevitably puts this at risk. After the effects of the past few years, this has a considerable impact on the children. Holiday requests in term time cannot be authorised as ensuring good attendance in school is a legal obligation.

Please note that learning and celebration continue until the end of the summer term when we will be ensuring smooth transition into new year groups and celebrating the children's achievements.

Year 1

Year 1 have started their new learning journey through their core text: The Jungle Book! We had to search for clues that led us to our book in our new jungle area! This week we have been busy listening to the story and creating a story map to showcase our understanding of it.

In Maths we have been learning all about position and direction. Ask us to show you our left and right hands! We went outside and created a car track to guide each other through.

We have enjoyed finding out where jungles are in the world (near the Equator) as well as learning lots about the animals and location of the Amazon rainforest this week. In Science we have also transplanted our growing plants into the outdoor area; we spotted our first pea pod the other day!

Year 2

Year 2 have had a super two weeks continuing our learning journey! As part of our Weather theme, we embarked on a fantastic visit to Yorkshire Water in Headingley! The children were fascinated to see the working site and tour around a variety of machines. They demonstrated fantastic inquiry skills and came away with such incredible facts and knowledge about water and the water cycle! This has been a great hook into our Geography and Science learning! We have continued our learning to explore different types of clouds.



In Literacy, the children have been applying their new knowledge from our visit to write a variety of texts. They have composed a detailed recount of the day, a report of the water cycle and a poem! We have been retrieving all the different literary devices we have learnt across the year to apply them into our writing and set ourselves high expectations. This week, we have started exploring shape poems.

In Maths, we have completed our unit on measuring length and height. Since using non-standard units, we have developed our understanding of centimetres and metres to explore their relation and how to convert measure-

ments. We have now begun learning about time. We can confidently read and draw the time for o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.

We are also had a brilliant Sports Day on Friday. All the children demonstrated fantastic teamwork and it was lovely to welcome our community back into school!

In Literacy, we have been producing some outstanding pieces of writing! We have been working hard to collect all the key features of a newspaper report together to write our own based upon 'Charlotte's Web.' They have used their planning effectively to ensure they are included ambitious vocabulary and reported speech. We are super proud of all the hard they have put in to complete this.

In Maths, we have been comparing and ordering fractions using bar models to help us. We went outside to explore how we can compare fractions and place these into different groups - we really liked finding so many possibilities for one problem!
