RECEPTION

On Monday, we read Pumpkin Soup by Helen Cooper and discussed the key themes of friendship and sharing. We revealed an enormous pumpkin grown locally in Mrs Rex's allotment! The children thought it felt extremely cold to touch but it would be a good idea to cut it open and taste it! During the week, the children enjoyed creating magical pumpkin soup recipes in the giant cauldron, tapping nails into pumpkins using real tools such as hammers and googles, painting in the style of Yayoi Kusama and creating a pumpkin leaf collage using the beautiful Autumn leaves. They have also continued to build interesting structures in the construction area using torches to cast shadows as well as develop narratives with the characters in the doll's house and pumpkin fairy small world.

In **Literacy**, the children are drawing and writing their own pumpkin soup recipes and shopping lists. In Read Write Inc. Phonics, we are continuing to learn set 1 sounds and blend sounds together to form words such as 'mat, sat, mad, pin, tap' on magnetic boards. We are also striving to use key vocabulary in our play such as 'pipkin' and 'stir'.

In **Maths**, we are learning all about the number 4 so that we can accurately count objects into our pumpkin soup recipes. The children have also learnt a rhyme to write the number 4 'down and across and cut it in half'.

In PE, the children became robots and created a robotic dance mirrored with their partner. On Wednesday, we introduced the children to our new climbing wall. They can't wait to practise traversing across the challenging area building strength, balance and agility in preparation for writing.





In **Music**, we have been learning to sing 'Peter Hammer' and '1 finger and thumb'. The 'finger disco' has been extremely popular this week with lots of smiles and laughter. What an incredible week of learning!

YEAR 1

A super fortnight in Year 1 as we have deepened our understanding of the purpose of castles. We have learnt about the features that help defend a castle from an enemy attack. In **History** we have drawn castles to show all of these important features and labelled our own Year 1 castle outside.

It was fascinating hearing about Medieval castles first-hand on our visit to **Pontefract castle** on Tuesday! We had an amazing time and amazed the teachers there with our fantastic history knowledge! Our favourite parts were flying around the castle grounds as baby dragons and even exploring the dungeon!



In **Maths** we have been comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equal to. We have been learning The Hungry Alligator song to help us understand how to show this using symbols!

Our **Art work** is looking fantastic and we have been experimenting with using a range of watercolour techniques and line styles to ad details and delicate touches to our art work.

YEAR 2

What a busy two weeks in year two! We have demonstrated our inquisitiveness and questioning skills throughout our mining theme to extend and challenge our learning.

In **English**, we have completed our hot write retells of 'Town is by the sea' and are ready to publish! We have really strived to think about the impact of our writing on the reader to help us reflect on our choice of vocabulary and literacy devices used.

In **Maths**, we have started our new unit on addition and subtraction. We have explored number bonds to 10 and how we can apply them into adding 3 numbers. We have used a variety of manipulatives, including ten frames, part whole models and place value counters to help us represent and add numbers.





In Science, we have continued our learning on living things and their habitats. Our focus this week is food chains, investigating how living things depend on each other for food and energy.

In Art, we have applied our colour mixing skills to create tints and tones for our Art work background.

YEAR 3

Year 3 have been so busy with their learning the last two weeks and they have achieved so much!

Our **outdoor learning day** allowed us to explore everything about the Stone Age, from chronology and fire lighting to flint knapping. We took away so much fascinating information and it was amazing to see the phenomenal knowledge the children could retain!

In **English**, we have been exploring Mary Anning and collating all of our knowledge on her to create our biography plans. We will be writing our biographies this week and showcasing all of the skills we have learnt so far.

In **Maths**, we have tackled even more number lines and estimated where numbers belong. Our learning on place value has concluded with our hot maths where we demonstrated everything we have learnt so far this term.

YEAR 4

Jerry Clay Academy

We have had a fantastic couple of weeks in Year 4! The children continue to strive with their learning and have shown great maturity and care as they apply for all the new roles in school.

In **Maths**, we have started addition and subtraction, they have blown me away with their success at adding and subtracting with exchanging. This is something I am sure will continue as we delve deeper into the concept.

In **English** we have created our hot writes for our Greek myths. The children have worked very hard to include: similes, expanded noun phrases, alliteration as well time adverbials. They are brilliant and we cannot wait to publish them next week.

We hosted our very own **Olympic Games** this week. We looked at the difference between the modern games and Ancient Greek games and then took part in some of the events such as javelin, discus and even horseracing! The winners were also rewarded with their own wreath as they did not have medals in ancient times.

YEAR 5

Year 5 has had a great couple of weeks as they continue to wow me! They are really enthusiastic about our topic, **The Great Divide**. We have explored the allies and axis of WW2, The Blitz and how the war ended. We have also made fantastic recipe booklets whilst thinking about the required and rationing during WW2.

In Art, we have sculpted clay tiles of a lighthouse, linking with our core text; 'Letters to the Lighthouse'

In **English**, we have started to learn about the features of a newspaper report and how we can use them. We have used role play to gather our quotations and explore how we can turn these into direct and reported speech.

In Maths, we have been learning how to apply different mental strategies to addition and subtraction calculations so that we can answer questions quickly and confidently. We have also explored inverse operations and understand how this can help us check our answers.
