Subject: Art Year Group: 3 Term: Spring

Core Learning of This Unit:

The children use their **theme of The Lost World** in order to produce a high quality piece of **3D art**, using an intricate understanding of malleable materials in order to recreate 2D as 3D. Children should be starting to use equipment with increasing confidence whilst planning and developing their own ideas. Children should begin to independently use the planning process to make simple choices about media and show their understanding of different adhesive methods. Through encouragement, children should consider the size that they would prefer to create at and consider aesthetics and surface textures. This work should be comparable to an artists' through annotations and ongoing reference within sketch books. Children should be starting to consider light, shadow, space and size within their work.
