Subject: Spanish Year Group: 4 Term: Spring

Core Learning of This Unit:

- Zoo animals

- Follow a story using visual clues
- Scan a text to identify key words
- Recognise some letters of the alphabet
- Ask and answer questions

- The verb 'ser'

- Say five vowel sounds in Spanish with teacher support
- Know the sound of the letter I in Spanish
- Read familiar words with accurate pronunciation
- Write a short sentence adapting a model, using noun, verb and adjective

- Participate in a drama in Spanish and memorise and recite a short, spoken sentence
- Play a game in groups, communicating with friends in Spanish
- Know about aspects of everyday life in Spain and make comparisons with their own traditions

- Present a short role play introducing family members, asking and answering questions
- Acquire cultural knowledge about family life in Spain
- Perform a South American song
- Re-order words to form a short, simple sentence
