Core Learning of This Unit:

The children will create a **Puppet show** as part of their **Adveristy theme**.

They will use reclaimed materials and textiles to complete their puppets and stage.

As part of this, pupils should be able to Select appropriate tools, materials, components and techniques; assemble components make working models; use tools safely and accurately; construct products using permanent joining techniques; make modifications as they go along, pin, sew and stitch materials together create a product Eventually Achieving a quality product

Their final art piece could form the backdrop for this puppet show.

Prior Learning:

- Draw up a specification for their design
- Develop a clear idea of what has to be done, planning how to use materials, equipment and processes, and suggesting alternative methods of making if the first attempts fail
- Use results of investigations, information sources, including ICT when developing design ideas
 - Select appropriate materials, tools and techniques
 - measure and mark out accurately
 - use skills in using different tools and equipment safely and accurately
 - cut and join with accuracy to ensure a good-quality finish to the product.
