# RECEPTION Maths

In Maths, we are learning all about shapes and patterns so that we can recognise, describe and create repeating patterns. The children have been creating repeating patterns from natural objects and coloured cubes. Next week, we will continue to build on this further.

#### **Literacy**

In Literacy, the children have been learning how to type messages and lists on a type writer using their phonic knowledge and physical dexterity. We are also striving to write a simple sentence using previously taught Action Words such as 'I', 'am', 'you', 'are' and concentrating on correct letter formation. In Phonics, we are really persevering to build on our reading fluency and super speedy reading.

On Monday, we read 'The Nativity' story to coincide with our Nativity performances this week. The children have been incredibly busy rehearsing, singing and practising their speaking parts as well as acting out the story in our playground area.

They were thrilled to discover our indoor role-play area had converted into a stable with Baby Jesus and the animals! On Tuesday, the children learnt about Christmas traditions around the world.

Next week, we will be building on this further as well as joining the whole School for a Christingle service at the local church and celebrating with a Christmas lunch and party. Please look out for further information via Parent Mail.

#### **Woodland Animals**


Last week, we read a range of non-fiction books about woodland animals including foxes, squirrels and hedgehogs. We discussed the difference between fiction and non-fiction books and learnt facts about our favourite woodland creatures. We used the contents page to help find and retrieve information throughout the week. The children have demonstrated such fabulous inquiry skills! Throughout the week, we have drawn detailed pictures, created woodland animal collages and animal footprints in the salt dough.

#### Art

The children have been investigating shapes and patterns through our focus artist 'Kandinsky'. They have enjoyed creating their own shape pictures with transparent 3D objects and lolly sticks on the lightbox and creating their own textured shape art utilising tissue paper and straws. What wonderful imaginations.

# YEAR 2

The weeks are flying by in Year 2 and we cherishing the magical memories we are able to make together during this festive period. We have been rehearsing our nativity 'A Midwife Crisis' and we are so excited to share this with you next week. We also designed and created our own baubles to decorate our magical JCA Christmas tree!

In **English**, we have been recapping ALL the SPAG and Literacy devices we have learnt so far in Year 2. Looking deeply into the purpose of each device has helped us to see the impact and affect each one has on the reader. We reflected and critiqued how we could apply them into our own writing.

In **Maths**, we have started our new unit on money. When identifying different coins, we have applied our knowledge of shape and their properties to help us recognize the similarities and differences. Applying our place value and addition skills, we have begun to count and add amounts of coins and notes.

As part of our **DT project**, we have practiced our skills to create pastry for our 'tin miner pasties'. It was vital that we measure the ingredients accurately and we found it challenging to develop our 'rubbing' skills to combine the butter and flour.

In **Science**, our unit 'Animals including humans' explores the life cycles from all animal groups. We have been striving to use new scientific vocabulary and the definitions to identify animal offspring, live young and the similarities and difference between the animal groups.





It has been a busy few weeks in Year 3 as we are now fast approaching the end of term! The children have produced so much fantastic work, fueled by the wealth of knowledge they have learnt so far this year.

For Music, Year 3 held their own magical ukulele performance for parents. They were able to showcase the chords they had learnt so far and used teamwork and careful timing to produce some fantastic singing with the rhythm sticks. What a lovely way for the children to display everything they have achieved in such a short amount of time!

In **DT**, the children have been showcasing their prior knowledge of different sewing skills from Year 2.

We built upon these skills by introducing the 'whip stitch' which was modelled alongside visuals and clear steps, so that the children could practice and perfect their technique. They used their new knowledge of the 'whip stitch' to observe how they might incorporate it into a design for a fabric Christmas decoration.

For English, the children have collected all of their knowledge and prior work from 'Stone Age Boy' to be able to plan and produce an exciting diary entry. They focused on one key date from the story and retold it from the point of view of the boy using adjectives, adverbs and time adverbials to create a vivid image for the reader.

# YEAR 4

We have had a brilliant couple of weeks in year 4. The children have shown great inquisitive skills in all their learning and have really challenged themselves with their learning.

In Maths, we are continuing our unit on multiplication and division, we have learnt, sang and chanted all of our times tables and the children are learning how to multiply three 1-digit numbers together. We have also explored different factor pairs to help us multiply. They are really striving with this and persevering even when it has been difficult.

In **English**, we have been reading our core text of 'Beowulf' linking to our theme of Anglo-Saxons. The children have impressed many adults around school with their fantastic writing focusing on a battle between the hero and the villain. It has also been amazing to them use our whole school word of the month, 'compassionate' correctly in their writing too.

In **History** we were lucky enough to go back in time to 1939 and travel to Sutton Hoo in East Anglia. The children excavated artefacts and showed good enquiry skills trying to match the artefact with the person they belonged to.

In **Science** the children have been looking at water vapour and how it evaporates, condenses and freezes. They have investigated this and found it fascinating, with some excellent investigation write ups.





Year 5 have continued to impress us over the past couple of weeks. They have demonstrated their love for learning in every lesson and have shown resilience and determination in learning new concepts.

Year 5 are thoroughly enjoying our **Geography** lessons and learning about mountains. They have drawn their own fantastic detailed diagrams of mountains with clear labels.

The whole class have blown us away with the amazing progress they have been making in their swimming lessons. Their confidence and stamina have shone through, and the development of their skills and ability is a testament to this.

We are extremely excited about Christmas. We created our beautiful individual Christmas Tree decorations and made a wish as we hung them on the tree. This was a precious moment enjoyed by all. Year 5 love practicing our Christmas carols, and they look forward to showing you their delightful singing voices.

Watching Year 5 grow and develop, both academically and personally, over the term has been a joy to watch. They have challenged themselves and strived to be the best they can be, and because of this, I am super proud of them.

In **Maths**, we have been learning about finding percentages and in English, we have continued to

learn about writing newspaper reports.
