#### **Frozen Planet**

Our new starting point for learning this term is 'Frozen Planet'. Throughout the term, the children will be learning about life in the Arctic and Antarctic regions including animals, environment, people and transport.

#### **The Great Explorer**

On Monday, we read 'The Great Explorer' by Chris Judge before embarking on our own Arctic adventure at School. The children discussed what they should pack in their backpack and we set sail on our ship heading North. The children packed a range of items including binoculars, compasses, cups, a sleeping bag and a tent, lots of food, maps and a flare in case they got into danger. They encountered an Iceberg, walrus and a polar bear before sheltering in the igloo. The children discovered that Mrs Rex was injured. What an exciting hook for the children's learning!

# YEAR 1

What a lovely start to the new year - we were very surprised on our first day back when the postman delivered a parcel – it was Paddington in a suitcase! There was a letter inside the suitcase from Aunt Lucy too. In **English**, we are now working towards writing a letter back to Aunt Lucy to tell her that Paddington has arrived at JCA safely! We have enjoyed reading the story of Paddington, retelling it orally, through role play and on our super story maps!

Outside we have our own Year 1 **Post office**, where we are striving to use our vocabulary and write letters independently. We are really enjoying learning all about the postal system, using stamps and packing parcels, and especially dressing up as post people!

The children have responded positively and with interest to our **Anti-Bullying** focus in PSHE this week. We have been filling each other's buckets each day by sharing kind comments and being caring. Each day we have discussed how full our buckets are and we will continue to do so as the children have responded really well to this analogy.

This half term in **PE**, we are developing our dance and movement skills.

# YEAR 2

A magical start to our learning journey for Spring term. Year 2 have strived with the effort and care we are showing towards our learning across the curriculum and we are intrigued by our new theme 'Do we always appreciate what we've got?'

In **English**, we have introduced our new core text 'Pretty Salma' and explored how the structure and characters in the story impacts the audience. This has inspired us with how we can plan our own African stories.

In Maths, we have continued our unit on money. We are striving to use a variety of coins to represent amounts in different ways using equivalent coins and amounts. Using our understanding of inequality symbols, we have compared total amounts to see how different combinations can be greater than, less than and equal to.

In Art, we have been inspired by our new focus artist Lubaina Himid. Looking in detail, we reflected on her artist style and choice of colours, patterns and materials and created mood boards to experiment with her style.

What a lovely start we have had to our Spring term! Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed their new learning across the curriculum and are intrigued to explore our new theme of 'What is Community?' further.

In **English**, we introduced our first Spring core text of 'The Boy Who Harnesses the Wind' written by the inspirational William Kamkwamba. The children combined English and Geography knowledge in our first lesson to piece together a map of Africa which revealed our book would be set in Malawi. We then read our new text aloud looking at how the illustrations impact the reader and also compared William's life to ours.

In Maths, we have continued our learning on Multiplication and Division. We are striving to recall our 3s, 4s and 8s times tables rapidly so that we can answer a range of questions surrounding these. Using our knowledge of all our times tables we have made links and found patterns across these to help us remember key strategies to recall. In **Music**, we have been learning to use the pulse and tempo so that we can learn songs with split vocal sections. The children were eager to showcase what they had remembered on their ukuleles, practicing the chords of C and F and interchanging these chords when playing.

In **Geography**, we have explored European countries and located these accurately on a map. The children had such a wealth of knowledge on these and enjoyed using our atlases to pinpoint where they are in comparison to England.



## YEAR 4

Year4 have had a brilliant start to our new theme 'How can small actions eventually change the world?'. We are already so eager to find out more using geography to drive this term's knowledge including learning about different rainforests in the world as well as the role we have to protect our plant and be sustainable.

In **English** we have started our core text 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell, the children used the clues such as an explorer hat, vines and a plane to predict what our story would be about and are keen to read the story every day to find out more!

In Maths, we have worked hard on our multiplication and division unit to use a variety of methods to help us. The children are very excited to start short division using the bus stop method to divide and so far, they have impressed us so much with their perseverance and enthusiasm with this.

In Art, we have worked hard to produce lovely mood boards inspired by our focus artists John dyer and Nixiwaka Yawanawa, they learnt to 'wash away the white and created beautiful pieces as a result. We then worked on selecting and mixing colours to produce different rainforest leaves.

In **PSHE** this week, the children have worked hard to fill each other's 'buckets' with kindness after reading the book 'Have you filled a bucket today?'. This has been fantastic to see the warmth and kindness each remember has shown to one another after they created hearts with kind thoughts about each other on it.

Year 5 have had a great start to 2023. They have wowed me with their enthusiasm, resilience and attitude towards learning. Their knowledge of fractions has shone through in their assessments, this is due to their hard work. They have finished writing and publishing their diary entries about a day living in the war. All of the children should feel incredibly proud of these.

We have thoroughly enjoyed our new theme launch, piecing together our own puzzles to create a map which led us into our new core book, 'The Girl Who Speaks Wolf'. Year 5 have been enchanted with the opening of this book. This term, we will focus on the Question, 'What is the difference between living and surviving?' We will explore this question in Geography whilst studying where and how different animals live around the world.

In **English**, we have started learning about the different features of an explanation text. We have annotated an example and explained how each

feature is effective. Moving forward, we will write our own explanation texts about animals and their habitats. Year 5 continue to show their devotion towards reading. Thank you for your efforts at home to ensure the children are reading and encouraging reading for pleasure.

In **Maths**, we will be exploring different methods of multiplication and division to help us answer questions quickly and accurately. We will apply this learning to more complex word problems while developing our problem-solving skills.

This week in **PSHE** our focus has been 'antibullying' we have enjoyed filling up each other's buckets with kind words, compliments and positivity.

## YEAR 6

The Theme title for Year 6 this term is 'Does Adversity Make You Stronger?'. The theme will have a Geography driver, focusing on Natural Disasters such as Earthquakes; we will look at causes of these natural disasters and will research different case studies to show the impact of them. We will look to infer why some places are more prone to these natural disasters. In History, the focus surrounds the Invictus Games. We will be looking at how some athletes overcome adversity and will learn about the variety of inspirational stories that surround the games. We will also follow on from some of our prior learning, particularly from Year 2, where we will learn about famous people from the past who have overcome adversity.

In Art, we will focus on colour, and will use Picasso as inspiration for our work.

In **English**, we will focus on the genres; informal diary entry, explanation text and persuasion text an this will ensure that we can develop a range of writing skills.

Finally, in **Maths**, we will complete our unit on fractions, decimals and percentages before re-capping many different skills we have learnt throughout Key Stage 2.

We have made a brilliant start to the Spring term, look at some examples of the fantastic writing our children are producing.
