RECEPTION

People that help us

On Monday, we discussed the different types of people that help us in the community including Doctors, Mountain Rescue, Dentists, Fire fighters and Policemen. The children have been concentrating on learning about fire fighters in preparation of a pre-planned visit from Ossett Fire Station. The children have been busy drawing and creating model fire engines as well as writing 'Action Word' sentences about the emergency services.

Physical Education

In PE, the children relished climbing and travelling on, through and over the large apparatus building core body strength and fundamental movement skills.

Mathematics

In Maths, we are learning about measuring time so that we can find out how long it takes to navigate the ski / toboggan course. The children have learnt how to use stop watches to 'time' their partner perform

different actions as well as complete the ski course. Throughout the week, we have been playing a game called 'high five, high ten' and have learnt all about the numbers 9 and 10.

Skiing and tobogganing

This week, the children continued to build ski courses with different difficulty levels to reflect the black, red and green ski runs down the mountain. We have also been striving to write signs! The children enjoyed creating a ski lift pulley system out of milk containers and rope as well as building a magnificent toboggan course. It was wonderful to see the children so engaged in their learning. The children are really shining brightly and applying their knowledge to create their own fabulous play projects.

Literacy

In Literacy, we are learning to write words and simple sentences so that we can write about the people that help us in the community. The children have also been designing their own ski slope passes, posters and signs to use in 'Ski School'.

YEAR 1

Year 1 have enjoyed the last fortnight of their Paddington theme, and especially loved sharing some of their learning with you at our Marmalade morning yesterday. Thank you to all of you that were able to attend and create some special memories with your child!

We have now published our letters to Aunt Lucy beautifully, striving so high to complete these with 100% effort, striving with our vocabulary and our very best handwriting.

During Maths, we have been comparing and ordering numbers. We have really enjoyed developing our understanding of numbers in depth this half term, including the way we describe and see numbers in different ways.

We have loved developing our knowledge of significant people this half term in **History**; over the half term we have found out about the lives of Queen Victoria, Florence Nightingale and Rosa Parks. We have considered their impacts on society today, from the inventions during Victorian times that we still have today to the impact of Rosa Parks on helping to create an equal society today.



YEAR 2

Year 2 are continually impressing us with their learning journey! They are enthralled in our current learning and keep striving higher and higher!

In **English**, we have written, critiqued and edited our final versions of our African stories inspired by 'Pretty Salma'. To improve our writing, we have reflected on the structure of the story and how this impacts the reader's feelings and engagement in our story. We can't wait to publish our stories and share them with you!

In Maths, we have continued to explore our unit on multiplication and division, using a variety of manipulatives to represent our methods. This week, we have practiced sharing to divide into equal groups and used sentence stems to talk through our method. Through our stepped approach, we discovered the number sentence is commutative!

In Art, we have experimented with different media to explore our colour palette for our African masks. Inspired by our focus artist 'Lubaina Himid', we mixed primary colours to create bright, bold secondary colours. We reflected that water colours wouldn't be a suitable media as they weren't as bold and bright as acrylic!

In **Geography**, we have applied our knowledge of physical and human features to compare the similarities and differences between Wrenthorpe and a South African village. In **History**, we have researched Nelson Mandela and why he is a significant person in history. We discovered the he was a philanthropist and was the first black president of South Africa.

YEAR 3

What a fantastic couple of weeks we have had to round up our half term! We have completed so much learning and showcased an abundance of enthusiasm.

In **English**, we have been refining our editing skills to ensure that we could make our hot writes on 'The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind' the very best that they could be. We have enjoyed publishing these play scripts and cannot wait to share these with you on our parent workshop day. Our new core text of 'Arthur's Golden Rope' has been introduced at the start of this week and we have been enthralled reading about Arthur's journey into the land of the Vikings.

For **Maths**, we have completed our topic of Multiplication and Division where we have shown outstanding perseverance with some of the most challenges strategies learnt yet in Year 3! We have looked at flexible ways to partition in order to divide larger numbers and used concrete resources to develop our understanding of remainders. In Art, we completed our final Celtic amulet designs linked to the Vikings. We focused on rotating and repeating patterns, making sure to use our artist of Michael Carroll to refer back to for inspiration. We then will be carving our intricate designs onto clay to reach our end goal of a Viking amulet.

In **Geography**, we have been using atlases and our local knowledge to find Wakefield on a map. We created a mini fact file to explain which continent, country, region and county Wakefield is in.

What a fantastic couple of weeks we have had in year4. I have been beaming with pride at their learning attitudes as well as their brilliant work!

In **English**, we have just finished our unit on 'The Explorer', the children have worked extremely hard to create a fantastic story all about a boy being lost in the amazon rainforest. They have strived to include: expanded noun phrases, adverbs and varying sentence structures to build suspense.

In **Maths**, we have just begun our unit on fractions, the children are already impressing me with their knowledge of the unit as well as how eager they are to find out more!

In Art, we have taken inspiration from our focus artist John Dyer to create beautiful rainforest scenes using acrylic paint on canvas. The children worked hard to create a bold vibrant piece carefully selecting colours and understanding how the paint would settle on canvas.

In **Spanish** we have loved learning all about pets in Spanish, we have learnt stories, organized sentences and even sang a song about pets!

We were also lucky enough to visit the outdoor library with Mrs Pickersgill, the children loved being challenged to find a story for their friend and then cuddled up read even in the wind!

Year 5 have had a great half term and have continued to make us proud with their attitude towards learning, determination and focus. We have explored our theme of 'What is the Difference Between Living and Surviving?' by writing explanations about our chosen animal. The children included parenthesis, technical vocabulary, and fronted adverbials in these writing pieces. Using our explanations, we each created our own documentaries.

In **Maths**, we have learnt different types of multiplication and division methods. The children then chose the most efficient method for their calculations/ problems. We have also learnt how to multiply an integer by a fraction.

Year 5 have blown us away with their progression in **Geography** – they have all been striving to be the best they can be. They have loved locating and identifying different capital cities and have built a great understanding of longitude and latitude.
