The buzz of learning in Reception!

Tiddler

On Monday, we shared 'Tiddler - the story telling fish' by Julia Donaldson and discussed the meaning of a 'tall tale' and having a big imagination! The children enjoyed repeating key phrases throughout the week such as 'Oh no he didn't, oh yes he did', 'it's only a story said Rabbitfish and Redfin' and 'tiddler's late' as well as learning new vocabulary including glimmered, thrashed, captured and dawdle. We went on an outdoor rhyming word hunt to read and write the rhyming words from the text.









The Robot & the Bluebird

Year 1 have started the half term so well, with such enthusiasm for our new core text: The Robot and The Bluebird. We have enjoyed making predictions, using drama and role play, creating our own robots using 2D shapes, and describing our robot using our striving adjectives we have taken from the text. Ask your child to tell you the meanings of: hollow, towering, rusting, and astonished.

In Maths, we have been developing our addition skills with larger numbers. This week we have completed focus activities indoors and outdoors using different concrete resources to support us with our accuracy and speed.

We enjoyed a wonderful visit to the Jamia Masjid Swafia Mosque last Thursday, consolidating lots of our RE knowledge about the Islamic faith. The children shared their prior knowledge and asked some fantastic questions – we were very proud of their incredible focus and listening skills!

On Wednesday, we had another lovely visit to the magical outdoor library - Mrs Pickersgill challenged us to find different book characters and then we found a book to read with a friend. We believe that making time to relax with a book is so important!

Do we appreciate what we've got?

Time is flying by in Year 2 as we start the second Spring term. We have been incredibly busy exploring our theme 'Do we always appreciate what we've got'.

In **English**, we have published our African stories inspired by 'Pretty Salma' and we cannot wait to share them with you at our parent workshop! As we move on with our writing journey, we are now exploring a non-fiction piece of writing. Continuing to use our core text, we have identified the features of a recipe so that we can write instructions, 'How to make a Pretty Salma fruit salad'!

In **Maths**, we are persevering with our learning on multiplication and division and we have continued to use manipulatives to explore different representations. As we approach the end of our unit, we will be exploring doubling, halving and odd and even numbers.

In Art, we have completed our final Art piece and created incredible African masks inspired by our focus artist 'Lubaina Himid'. We have layered our cardboard to create 3D detail, painted our background and foreground and outlines the details. After the stepped process, we are so proud to see our final outcomes, as a culmination of all the knowledge and skills learnt along the process.

In **PE**, we are exploring the skills we need for net games. This week, we developed our chest pass and critiqued our accuracy and control.

In RE, we are continuing of focus on Christianity. Last week, we began by inspiring our learning with a fantastic visit to Wakefield Cathedral. It was brilliant to explore the Cathedral, ask thoughtful questions and experience the place of worship in such detail.


What a brilliant two weeks Year 3 have had! We thoroughly enjoyed welcoming in parents for our Viking workshop to showcase some of our great outcomes!


In **English**, we have been analysing a range of haiku poems and exploring their features. We have taken inspiration from our text of 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' to retell a section of the story in the form a haiku poem. We will then be editing our poems to strive to add more ambitious vocabulary!

In Maths, we have started our new topic of Length and Perimeter where we have been retrieving prior learning on measurement to support our current learning. We have used rulers accurately to measure and draw lines with centimetres and millimetres. We have also started looking at equivalent lengths and converting between different units of measurements.

We have really been enjoying our Music lessons and developing our skills on the ukuleles. This week we focused on singing a round which required us to sing at different times to each other with a range of tunes. We have also begun learning the new chords of A and G to help us play more challenging songs.

In PE, we have been mastering our throwing and catching skills in order to be effective in for net games. Our focus has been on aiming for a particular target for the ball to land in or to bounce in and our partner to catch.





How can small actions eventually change the world?

What a brilliant couple of weeks we have had in Year 4! The children have been fantastic showing great learning attitudes and have loved carrying on our theme of 'How can small actions eventually change the world?'

In **Maths**, we have been focusing on fractions. The children have impressed us so much with their knowledge of improper fractions, mixed number fractions and how to convert between them. They can even find equivalent fractions on number lines, which is fantastic!

In **English** we have started our unit of persuasive letter writing. Our end piece will be to write to another class to persuade them to recycle more. They have already explored a WAGOLL (what a good one looks like) and had time to identify and define different vocabulary which they might use in their letters.

In **Geography**, we have thoroughly enjoyed learning about deforestation and climate change and how these factors are impacting our planet. The children took part in a debate to fully understand why deforestation happens and the pros and cons of it. They showed fantastic geographical knowledge throughout this.

We were very fortunate to go and visit a Gurdwara this week in Leeds as part of our Sikhism unit in RE. The children showed great respect and enthusiasm for the religion as they were taught how Sikhs prayed, the activities that they do at the Gurdwara and were even lucky enough to try some food which they kindly brought us. It was brilliant to hear our children's knowledge being applied. This was a fantastic trip which the children enjoyed so much!


YEAR 5


Team-work demonstrated in abundance

Year 5 have demonstrated their creativity, team-work and communication skills so much over the past 2 weeks. In **Design and technology**, we worked in groups to build a 'house with chicken legs' out of paper and tape. They thought carefully about the foundation, the structure and the weight of their creations. Our core text, 'The Girl Who Speaks Bear' inspired this design & has provoked so much quality book talk.

In Maths we have started our next unit, decimals and percentages. Year 5 have made a great start and are striving to understand the new concepts being taught. They have not only impressed the staff with their excellent attitude and application in Maths, but Year 5 have expressed how proud of their work they are. It is a joy to see the children bursting with pride.

In **English**, we have been learning about the different features of poetry. We have evaluated the impact of using figurative language such as, alliteration, personification and similes/metaphors. Year 5 have applied this learning to create their own brilliant poems.
