Subject Unit Overview **Year Group**: Year 4

Main strands within this History unit

Government	 The children will understand the different rules and regulations the Government brought in during the Industrial Revolution The children will understand the child laws in this time
Communication and trade	 The children will learn about textiles and how this was a large reason why west Yorkshire developed rapidly during the Industrial Revolution The children will understand the different roles in society and who were the traders and who were the makers The children will learn about different forms of transport such as the Railways and the Canals and how this transformed the amount of trade that could happen
Society	 The children will learn about the different classes in society and use sources to understand the point of view of different classes. The children will see how the Industrial Revolution helped and hindered certain classes and how beneficial it was for certain people.
Monarchy	 The children will learn about Queen Victoria and how it was during the Victorian Era the Industrial Revolution began and transformed working.
