RECEPTION

The 3 Billy Goats Gruff

On Tuesday, we read an alternative version of the traditional tale The 3 Billy Goats Gruff -'Listen My Bridge is so Cool' told by the Troll. We practised trip trapping over the bridges constructed in the outdoor area and then re-enacted the story using key refrains such as 'Who's that trip trapping over my bridge' and 'I'm going to gobble you up'. During the week, we imagined life as 'Arty the Troll' designing natural weaving frames and creating dandelion and blossom tea infusions, kindness potions and soup! We also built bridges across the river using loose parts, construction materials and Lego; modifying our designs to improve the strength, stability and size to ensure they are suitable for the goats to cross safely. The children have been carefully mixing different shades of green to paint Arty the Troll.

RECEPTION

Mathematics

We are learning to apply our mathematical knowledge to play games with our talking partner such as 'number track' and 'build a tower'. The children have been demonstrating excellent teamwork and listening skills as well as accurately counting to add and take away objects. We are striving to learn our number bonds to 5 and recall odds, evens and doubling facts too.

Literacy

In Literacy, the children are writing their own sentences with correct letter formation, capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. They are persevering to read sentences back to their friends to check it makes sense. On Thursday, the children wrote a letter to the 'Troll Patrol' asking for Arty to stay in post under the bridge!

In **Read Write Inc. Phonics**, we are concentrating on reading set 1 and 2 multi syllabic words at speed and Action Words including spellings every day. YEAR 1

Year 1 had an incredible visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park last week; we were so lucky to see polar bears up very very close! As well as this we saw lots of other animals, read lots of facts and took part in a workshop too!

In **English** we are continuing to work towards writing our own stories, inspired by our core text 'Leaf'. In **Maths** we have been investigating equal groups of objects, and arrays to support our multiplication unit.

We have started to write seed diaries in Science as we monitor the progress of the seeds we planted at the beginning of this term. Our rain catcher is also causing lots of excitement and discussions: it really does seem to be raining a lot in Spring!

YEAR 2

What a fantastic two weeks in our learning journey in Year 2! We started the week off with an incredible outdoor learning day exploring our theme **'What's the weather'.** We loved being meteorologists, measuring time with a sundial, working scientifically to investigate the temperature and creating rain sticks.

In **English**, we have been inspired by Benji Davies to create our own stories of 'Grandma Bird'. We have used the structure of the story to create our own characters and used phrases from the story to inspire our vocabulary and exciting sentences.

In **Maths**, we have continued our learning on time. We can now read the time to 5 minute intervals past the hour and draw the hands too! It has become an important part of our day and timetable and we love being able to use our Maths skills in a real life context.

YEAR 3

What a busy two weeks in Year 3! We loved celebrating the King's Coronation with such a special lunch and activities afterwards to further our knowledge!

In Maths, we have been working tremendously hard on mass and capacity. We have been exploring equivalent masses and comparing between kilograms and grams. Our steps to success have been really important when understanding volume and capacity this week. We used jugs to underdstand how to measure millilitres before challenging ourselves to find litres and millilitres.

In **English** we have been drafting and revising our persuasive arguments for our letters. We have been striving to include persuasive openers and rhetorical questions to add further persuasion. After completing our hot writes, we have now published our persuasive letters ready to display as part of our 'Charlotte's Web' display board!

We have been showcasing some brilliant essay writing in **RE** this week! We reflected on our recent topic of Judaism and collated all of our knowledge together to support our essay planning. Our precision of key vocabulary and expansion of knowledge has been wonderful to read.

In **DT**, some of us have begun creating our wooden photo frames. This has been a challenging project but we were so excited by the results and cannot wait to continue these.

YEAR 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant couple weeks, and are starting to really showcase their skills in all their learning.

In **English**, we have finished our unit on writing a diary as if we were a character in the Railway Children based on the novel by Edith Nesbitt. The children have been inspired by this and have created high quality pieces with added history knowledge about children at this time.

In **Maths**, the children have loved learning all about money. We are focussing on how they are written as decimals as well as rounding to estimate change given.

In **Science**, we have enjoyed starting our unit on Electricity. The children have been learning about different types of appliances, experimented with creating a series circuit and investigating when components make a complete or incomplete circuit. In Art, the children have enjoyed starting our art unit inspired by the artist William Morris. We have begun our unit by learning about his life as an artist and created a mood board based on his art work.



YEAR 5

We have been incredibly impressed with the development, maturity and respect shown in Year 5 over the past couple of weeks. We have completed lots of group work and they have demonstrated how well they can work in teams and how kind they all are.

In **English**, have been planning our adventure stories based on space. The children have dived into this unit and have loved researching and exploring the many facts they could include in their writing. I can't wait to read the finished pieces.

In Maths, Year 5 have blown us away with their knowledge and eagerness to learn about angles. Lots of the children have expressed how proud of themselves they have been and that they have never completed as much work in a maths lesson before. It is brilliant to witness the children striving to be the best they can be. As a result, the children are bursting with pride. In **Science**, we have studied how the Moon, Earth and the Sun work together. We have also enjoyed researching the different planets and finding ways of remembering their order of them.
