On Monday, we read 'What Ever Next' by Jill Murphy and discussed how baby bear imagined flying to the moon. The children have enjoyed re telling the story in the small world area and developing narratives about space and the solar system using the space themed resources. This sparked lots of interesting discussions and questions about astronauts and rocket launches.

During the week, we have learnt to sing new songs and rhymes including 'Zoom, Zoom, Zoom we're going to the moon, Tommy thumb and 2 Little Blackbirds'.

played an astronaut game using chiffon scarves.
The children scrunched them up and threw them in the air then caught the floating scarf. We also balanced bean bags on different body parts including our head, back and shoulders. The children are really striving to get dressed/undressed independently and fold their clothes including mastering buttons and zips. Please support your child by practising these skills at home.

Throughout the rest of the week, the children have been developing play projects in our indoor and outdoor provision. They have particularly enjoyed building in the sand and construction areas, constructing waterways and painting. The role-play and playdough areas still remain popular choices.

On Wednesday, our specialist yoga teacher joined us for 30 minutes to lead a super mindful and relaxing **yoga session**. The children practised a variety of breathing techniques and enjoyed balancing a pet friend on their head. Our favourite technique is the dragon breath. On Friday, the children enjoyed developing their gross motor skills and building core strength on the outdoor physical apparatus. We were so impressed at their perseverance and risk-taking skills!

YEAR 1

What a lovely start to the new year! Year 1 have enjoyed lots of learning both inside and outside the classroom as part of our first theme: Dungeons and Dragons.

Dragon eggs have stimulated our work in **English**, we have been concentrating on using adjectives of colours and shapes to describe them carefully. As well as this, in our creative work we have practised sketching the eggs and started to investigate watercolour paints to showcase all of the different beautiful colours.

In **Maths** we have been looking at different ways we can represent a number including on ten frames and on a number line, as well as practising writing the words.

We have been learning all about the four countries of the United Kingdom in Geography, we especially enjoyed finding the United Kingdom on Google Earth and playing a playground game with elastic.





YEAR 2

What a brilliant start to the year we have had in Year Two! We have settled well into our new routines and have been striving high with our expectations. This week we have shared our first repeated read 'Our class is a family' and enjoyed exploring our connections with each other.


In **English**, we have recapped our phonic skills and began exploring our core text 'Town is by the sea' for our mining theme. We have used our reading skills to make predictions while creating story maps to help us explore the structure of the story.

In Maths, Year 2 have demonstrated fantastic place value skills. We have explored 2-digit numbers and partitioned them into tens and ones using flexible partitioning, working both practically with concrete resources and moving towards writing number sentences. With Mrs Longley, Year 2 have explored 2d and 3d shapes and their properties.

The children demonstrated such inquisitiveness and an eagerness to learn!





What a brilliant start it has been to Year Three!
Now as part of Key Stage Two, the children have settled really brilliantly into routines and have been showcasing an incredible work ethic across subjects. They have enjoyed the introduction of our first theme 'The Lost World' and are excited to continue strengthening their knowledge on this.

In **English**, we have introduced our core text of 'Fossil' by Bill Thomson where the children have been using their own imaginations, facial expressions and body language from the pictures to piece together the story. We have focussed on the build-up and climax of the story, making a plan of what we want to include in our writing. We have been striving to include exciting fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and past tense verbs as we start out writing this week.

For Maths, we have been building on the children's place value knowledge from Year 2 and have introduced hundreds to make 3-digit numbers.

The children have loved using a range of practical resources to represent 3-digit numbers as well as partitioning numbers flexibly.

In **History**, we introduced our topic of Prehistoric Britain by working as a team to make a huge class timeline! We identified key time periods that we will be focussing on throughout the year and discussed where we would place these onto out timeline and why.

To link in with our learning on fossils, we have created observational drawings of ammonites in **Art.** We are looking forward to exploring our new artist and creating our final 3D pieces linked to ammonites.



In Maths, we have been learning all about place value. The children have shown great knowledge in this area and have impressed me with their partitioning skills. We have shown great resilience with flexible partitioning and they worked well as a team to flexibly partition 4-digit numbers.

In **English**, we have been working on the Iron Man by Ted Hughes as part of our theme 'A Hero's Journey'. They have written a lovely descriptive piece all about the character of the Iron Man and what happens to him. They worked hard to include adjectives, adverbs and interesting vocabulary. In PE, we have started our unit on invasion games. We have been focusing on rugby and they children have demonstrated brilliant throwing and catching the skills to show how they would intercept the ball from other players. We have also been very lucky to start our yoga lessons this half term which have been brilliant not only for our mindfulness time but also concentration in other lessons too.

We, have also started our learning in **History** all about the Ancient Greeks. The children were keen to learn so much and can already tell you so much about the society they lived in how they lived their lives.

YEAR 5

We have been thoroughly impressed with how quickly Year 5 have settled back into school and the drive and eagerness they have demonstrated. The children have particularly enjoyed playing 'Guess the Shelfie' in the outdoor library and practising mindfulness in Yoga. We have also enjoyed learning about WW2 in our theme, 'The Great Divide'. Year 5's curiosity about the theme has shone.


In English, we have been learning to write descriptive settings. Year 5 have included similes, metaphors, personification, alliteration and an abundance of adjectives in their writing.

In Maths, we have been developing our knowledge of place value. We can now compare and order numbers up to 1 million. We have practised writing 6-digit numbers as numerals and in words, as well as taking the time to read these numbers aloud.

In computing, we dived into our new unit, 'We Are Gamers'. We have been using Scratch to create our own game for others to play. Year 5 have thought carefully about the aim of the games and how they will engage the players.
