Thank you for your commitment to ensuring your child attends school every day. As a result, our attendance remains in the target zone. However, I am receiving quite a few ad-hoc requests for days off and holidays in term time. Please can we ask that this is avoided. Days off disrupt learning more than you can believe. We are still facing the challenge of building back after the COVID pandemic and need your support to ensure every child has good attendance.

RECEPTION

This week, the children have enjoyed participating in a pen disco each morning drawing a variety of wavy, zig zag and straight lines across their whiteboard – left to right. We have also been practising fundamental skills such as cutting with scissors. The children were delighted to observe and extract the sunflower seeds from the sunflower heads they found in the outdoor area.

Throughout the remainder of the week, we have focussed our attention to developing our art skills on line, pattern and shape. We have created prints using a variety of media such as tin foil, paint and round, square and rectangular objects. We are so proud of the children for their amazing confidence, perseverance and resilience.

RECEPTION

The Tiger who came for tea

On Monday, we read 'The Tiger who came for tea' by Judith Kerr. This led to a discussion about sharing, taking turns and talking about the rules that we have at home and School to keep us safe. We followed this up with a beautiful story called 'mine mine, mine said the Porcupine' and roleplayed scenarios of sharing resources with other children in School. On Tuesday, we watched 2 short animated video clips from 1 decision (our PSHE online resource) to build on our theme of sharing, emotions and relationships. In addition to this, the children have been creating 'powder paint' water tea infusions for the Tiger.

Literacy

The children are continuing to learn to read and write set 1 sounds in ability groupings. We have also introduced oral and sound blending using the sounds that they know. The children are getting really confident now using a magnetic boards and sound tiles to 'Fred Talk' and 'Read the Word'. This will be modelled at Friday Library so that you can practise at home with the resources in your parent phonics pack. The children have been continuing to practise recognising and writing their name in morning challenge.

Maths

In Maths, we are learning all about the number 4. The children have learnt different ways to represent 4 with numicon, actions, objects and learnt their number bonds. Eg 4 + 0 = 4, 3 + 1 = 4 and 2 + 2 = 4. We used cubes to build a 'number blocks 4 character' then changed its shape. On Thursday, we created giant squares from sticks and balls to form the shape. Next week, we will be focussing on the number 5.

YEAR 1

We have had another super couple of weeks in Year 1 as we have deepened our understanding of the purpose of castles. We have learnt about the features that help defend a castle from an enemy attack during our **History** lessons. We have learnt about Sandal Castle through story, and many of us have experienced this castle out of school which was lovely to hear about.

On Tuesday, we had our class visit to **Pontefract castlel** It was exciting transforming into dragons as part of a castle story and swooping around the ruins with Ilbert the dragon. We had a good look around, exploring artefacts from Medieval times and even crept down into the dungeon.

In **English**, we have completed our first hot write which is a beautiful description of our own dragons. The children have worked hard to include adjectives to create a picture in the readers' minds.

Our sketchbooks in **Art** our a joy to experiment in; over the last couple of weeks we've experimented with mixing, and applying watercolour paints using thick and thin brushes.





YEAR 2

Year 2 have continued to settle into new routines and expectations – we are blossoming into independent, striving learners!

In Maths, we have extended our learning on place value and applied our knowledge of tens and ones to estimate on a number line and compare number in different representations. To challenge our understanding, we have use mathematical vocabulary to solve and explain problems.

In **English**, we have been striving to develop our vocabulary and adjectives to create a detailed description for the reader. After receiving a concerning letter from the mine, we created descriptive posters to help find missing miner, Russ!

Following our visit to the National Coal Mining Museum, we were eager to locate other mines. Using atlases and maps, we developed our map skills to locate where coal mines were across the UK.

In **Science**, we are fascinated by our current unit on 'living things and their habitats'. We have identified the characteristics of a living things, explored different habitats and how animals are adapted to survive there. This week, we investigated microhabitats.

For our current **Art** project, we have explored mixing paint to create tones inspired by 'Valerie Ganz'.

YEAR 3

The weeks are flying by in Year 3 and the children are demonstrating a fantastic level of drive, enthusiasm and inquisitiveness with our current topic of 'The Lost World.'

In **English** we have been compiling all of our learning and writing skills to create our third person narratives based on our core text. We have taken such a care and pride when publishing our work and we cannot wait to see this on display in the coming weeks.

In **Maths** we have shown a fantastic understanding of place value when working with 3-digit numbers in a range of contexts. We are excited to be moving on to addition and subtraction where we have already been showcasing our mental arithmetic skills as well as written methods. As part of our **History** and **Science** learning on fossils, we were exceptionally lucky to have a visit from Dale who brought in a huge suitcase full of fossils for us to observe and explore! We were mesmerised and inspired by the range of artefacts and information he provided and the children are now eager to go hunting for fossils themselves.

In **Computing**, we have loved our new unit of 'We are Programmers!' The children have explored the programme of Scratch to understand how this will support them in creating their own animation. They have created their own storyboards and algorithms ready to begin creating next week.

YEAR 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant couple of weeks. We are starting to see a mature attitude and a drive for their learning which has been fantastic to see!

In Maths, we have been focussing on rounding to the nearest 10,100,1000. This has been a challenge, but the children have taken this in their stride and worked so hard to succeed in this area. They have also been striving in their Diamond Dash and we are starting to see lots of children driven to pass which has been amazing!

In **English**, we are starting to write our own Greek myth. The children have looked at many different Greek myths and are now using them as inspiration to create their own beasts and heroes. The children are so eager to write these that we have had many written at home in preparation, great effort!

We have been lucky enough to go to Mrs P's outdoor library this week which was extremely exciting. The children showed great respect towards the **books** and worked hard to pick a book that would be right for them.

YEAR 5

We have had a wonderful couple of weeks in Year 5. The class have immersed themselves into their learning of **WW2**. It has been fantastic to see the children's engagement and enthusiasm heightened. Year 5 particularly enjoyed trying on a WW2 Soldier's uniform and walking in their shoes for the afternoon.

In Maths, Year 5 have been working hard on addition and subtraction. They have mastered adding and subtracting 4-digit numbers using the column method. We are now working on using this knowledge to answer complex reasoning questions.

In **English**, we have been striving to create newspaper reports. The children have formulated brilliant plans, and I cannot wait to read their finished pieces. up. This did cot

YEAR 6

In **Science**, we have explored how to live a healthy lifestyle – we will be creating our own leaflets based on this and our previous knowledge.

In **History**, we have learnt about Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and how ancient Egyptians used the Nile and how their inventions have influenced other societies and our lives today.

Year 6 have been developing our 'perseverance' learner trait during our **Maths** lessons. We have worked so hard to master long division and have created our own tutorial videos to explain the method.
