Key Vocabulary:

Tomb - a large grave that is above ground

Pyramid - ancient stone buildings with four triangular sloping sides. The most famous pyramids are those built in ancient Egypt to contain the bodies of their kings and queens.

Pharaoh- a king of ancient Egypt **Afterlife**- a life that some people believe begins when you die, for example a life in

heaven or as another person or animal

sarcophagus- a large decorative container in which a dead body was placed in ancient times mummification- If a dead body is mummified, it is preserved, for example by rubbing it with special oils and wrapping it in cloth

canopic jar- A jar used in ancient Egypt to hold the organs from an embalmed body.

Tutankhamun, Egyptological pronunciation Tutankhamen, was an ancient Egyptian pharaoh who was the last of his royal family to rule during the end of the 18th dynasty during the New Kingdom of Egyptian history.
