#### **Christmas**

During the week, we have been building Santa's sleigh using outdoor construction equipment, creating Christmas cards, calendars, tree decorations and Christmas lists as well as wrapping parcels for Santa's sack in the sleigh and crafting Christmas stars in our Elf workshop. The children have also been busy re telling the Christmas story with finger puppets!

#### Maths

In Maths, we are learning about repeating patterns so that we can create Christmas patterns with peg boards, coloured cubes, collage materials and natural objects. We also applied our mathematical knowledge of pattern and size to create a Christmas tree themed calendar.

#### Literacy

In Literacy, we have been writing Christmas lists, showing off our phonic knowledge and beautiful letter formation. We have learnt 'The 12 days of Christmas' song and read an abundance of Christmas stories throughout the week.

YEAR 1

Year 1 have had an amazing term completely immersing themselves in our Dungeons and Dragons theme! We are incredibly proud of each and every one of them, their confidence is just shining now and we can't wait to see how this continues in 2024!

We have been so busy both inside and outside of school, learning in the classroom, outside and we have even been on 2 school visits to Pontefract Castle and St Anne's church. It has certainly been a term to remember. The children have enjoyed developing their **Art and DT** skills, working creatively in their sketchbooks in order to produce high quality outcomes in both subjects. Their work is sparkling on display in our classroom and we are so proud!

We have worked so hard on developing our Reading and Phonics, with lots of practice in school and at home too!
Additionally to this, we have continually been spending time Reading for
Pleasure; last week we were invited to their Magical Outdoor library. We were delighted when Mrs Pickersgill said we could take back all of the special Christmas books to share in class. We have been reading these all week!

This is Bethleham Nativity: what a wonderful way to end our first term in Year 1. The children spoke and sang so clearly on stage with everybody taking part and shining as part of our KS1 team! We have had a magical time celebrating Christmas in school, and are excited for the new year ahead!





progress they have made has been amazing and they have much to be proud of. Our theme this term has been 'Magnificent Mines'. After our visit to the National Coal Mining Museum back in September, we were hooked into our learning about coal mining. From History and comparing the Victorian Era to Modern day, to locating coal mines in Geography and creating mining portraits in Art, the children have become experts about coal mining!

Our final Art pieces – The children have persevered to develop new skills of mixing and creating tones to create detailed backgrounds and foregrounds. After being inspired by Valerie Ganz, the children applied their skills to create their own mining portrait. It took a lot of patience and perseverance to develop each step and they we so proud of their final outcome.

Published writing – After our visit to the mining museum, we discovered on of the miners had gone missing! We created detailed missing posters and developed our vocabulary and adjectives to created detailed descriptions using expanded noun phrases. The children then created, redrafted and published their own stories of 'Town is by the sea'.

**Nativity** – What a magical way to finish the term! The children sparkled on stage and it was incredibly special to share this memory with you!



What a brilliant and magical end it has been to our Autumn term! Our topic of 'The Lost World' has been a great source of enthusiasm and inquisitiveness for the children and it has been wonderful to watch this blossom. The children have also really enjoyed reflecting on their successes from this term and looking ahead to our Spring term.

Some of the things we have really enjoyed and are proud of from this term are:

Our final Art and DT products - the children have worked exceptionally hard on their Art and DT pieces, building on and adapting their skills from previous year groups. They thoroughly loved exploring textures and collaging to create their Ammonites as well as tackling the challenge of sewing to make their own special Christmas baubles.

Prehistoric Britain Trip - in November our trip to Barnsley Museum was fantastic, it really brought all of knowledge and enthusiasm to life. The children showed brilliant enthusiasm throughout the day and they have continued to increase their depth of knowledge surrounding Prehistoric Britain since our trip.

**Ukulele** - What a pleasure it has been to see the progress the children have made in their ukulele sessions with Mrs Garside! They have learnt a range of chords, how to strum and a whole range of technical songs.

For the Spring term we will be focussing on our new theme of 'What is Community' and beginning to explore the human and physical characteristics of our local area. We will look at what it means to be part of a community and also compare this to community within the time period of the Vikings.



progress the children have made since September has been amazing and I can see how year 4 ready they are now. Their enthusiasm towards our learning has been fantastic especially through our theme of 'A Hero's Journey' where we focused on the Ancient Greeks and the Anglo Saxons.

The children have also reflected on this term and all the exciting things we have accomplished:

Art final pieces: the children worked exceptionally hard on their Ancient Greek 3D masks with relief made from cardboard and other materials. The children looked at the history of the masks and what emotion they might portray to create a brilliant final product.

In Ancient Greeks we had our Olympic games where the children took part in Horse riding, javelin and other amazing activities to compare the games from then to now. The children also enjoyed turning into archaeologists in our Anglo-Saxon unit when we had to excavate the burial ground of Sutton Hoo and discover who the artefacts belonged to.

We have worked together this term in **PSHE** to build strong friendships and complement each other's learning.

We have had many other highlights this term including, our visit to Eden Camp, designing and creating our clay tiles and the brilliant published writing Year 5 have produced. The whole class have worked extremely well this term and we are super impressed with the attitude towards learning.

Next term, we will start our new topic, 'What's the difference between living and surviving?' and our core reading book will be 'The Girl Who Speaks Bear'. In Maths, we will continue to learn and practice different methods for multiplying and dividing. In English, we will focus on an explanation text's features.






trips. We continue to be so proud of all of them for their academic and personal achievements.


