Thank you for your commitment to ensuring your child attends school every day. As a result, our attendance remains in the target zone. However, I am receiving quite a few ad-hoc requests for days off and holidays in term time. Please can we ask that this is avoided. Days off disrupt learning more than you can believe. We are still facing the challenge of building back after the COVID pandemic and need your support to ensure every child has good attendance.





#### Maths

In Maths, we are learning to subtract so that Pedro the Penguin can count how many fish he has left to eat for his dinner. The children are using excellent mathematical vocabulary and reading and writing subtraction number sentences to record their findings. This week, the children have been learning how to measure time by using a stop watch to time how long it takes for their friends to complete the ski course then rewarding 1st, 2nd and 3rd place with gold, silver and bronze medals. Amazing application of mathematical knowledge!

#### **Lost and Found**

Last week, 'Pedro the Penguin' visited our classroom with a message that he had lost items from his suitcase and that he was lonely. The children set off straight away with a mission to help Pedro so that he would feel loved including a 'northern lights' tower, drawings of his family and artwork. We shared a story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers and discussed the feelings of loneliness and friendship.

#### Literacy

In Literacy, we are learning to write ski passes using our phonic knowledge and create maps of the ski courses and slalom events for 'Ski School'. Last week, we wrote lists and sentences for Pedro the Penguin so that he could remember what to take with him around the world in his suitcase. We are so proud of the children for their brilliant letter formation and 'fred finger' spelling. In Read Write Inc. Phonics, we are learning to read words speedily with a real focus on special friends.



Year 1 are fully immersed and engaged within our Paddington theme, and we are really looking forward to sharing some learning with you at our Marmalade morning! We have continued having our regular mindful minutes to focus on breathing and wellbeing.

During our **English** lessons, we've been developing our written letter to our audience - our families at home. We are striving with our vocabulary and very best handwriting to complete these ready to take to the post office next week so they can be posted!

As part of our **Maths** lessons, we have been working hard on numbers between 11 and 20; learning about the vocabulary of tens and ones to describe these. This week, we have worked as teams to create number lines from 0 to 20, and then independently to complete number lines with missing numbers with accuracy.

We have been keen to retrieve and develop our knowledge of vocabulary and significant people this half term in **History**; to add to our Autumn learning of Queen Victoria, this week we have been learning about Florence Nightingale using pictures and stories.

In **Maths**, we have explored how we can represent multiplication in different ways. Using the concrete, pictorial and abstract process we have drawn equal groups, repeated addition and arrays.

In **P.E**, we have started creating a dance inspired by our African theme. We have researched and practiced different moves using unison and canons. On Wednesday afternoon, we started the afternoon with a yoga mindfulness session.

In Art, we created vivid, vibrant mood boards inspired by our focus artist Lubaina Himid, an artist originally from Zanzibar.



In **English**, we have been drafting our paragraphs for our newspaper report and working really hard to include a range of emotive language, adverbials and quotes. We have used lots of peer assessment to edit and uplevel our work so that we have been able to then complete our hot writes. We are now looking forward to being able to publish and share our newspaper reports with others.

In Maths, we have been using rulers to measure a variety of different lengths as well as finding equivalent lengths. In order to find equivalent lengths and add and subtract lengths we have needed to practise our conversions between different units of measurement. We are continuing to retrieve our conversions so that we can make them as accurate as possible.

For Art, we have enjoyed using Michael Carroll as our inspiration for our final outcome on clay amulets. We looked at his level of intricacy and use of rotating and repeating patterns to sketch two of our own final designs ready to carve out of clay next week.

In **Science**, we have been exploring the forces of push, pull and friction. We planned and conducted an investigation with tested friction on different surfaces. We then concluded which surfaces had high friction and which ones had low friction.

# YEAR 4

It has been a lovely couple of weeks in Year 4. The children are striving with their learning and are eager to keep learning.

Last week, we had our fantastic outdoor learning day with Eden's Forest. The children showed great determination and perseverance, considering the weather, and thoroughly enjoyed the day. They learnt all about where rainforests are in the world, the effects of deforestation and the different groups of people within the rainforest and their view of deforestation. This has then led to the children's passion shining through and we are now putting all our new knowledge into our writing to persuade Mrs Swinburne to buy some more trees to plant in the school grounds.

The Children have also impressed me so much with their resilience with **short division**. We have introduced 'The bus stop method', although it is a challenge, the class have not given up and shown me how hard they can work to accomplish something!

In Art, we have focused on our key artist John Dyer.
During our lessons we have looked at the colours which
the artist uses and compared them, commenting on their
similarities and differences.







In **Maths**, we have explored multiplying fractions.

This included finding the whole and finding a fraction of an amount. Year 5's curiosity and determination in Maths this week has been admirable.

We have also been treated to a visit from **Dogs Trust**. Year 5 demonstrated brilliant reading, acting and teamwork skills during their session. The children analysed different situations to determine the best actions humans can take in each circumstance.



Year 6 have continued to work incredibly hard.

The last fortnight, we have been developing our algebraic skills - learning how to substitute, find missing value and write our own equations and formulae.

In **Science**, we have been deepening our leaning about how we see. We have learnt about the different parts of our eyes and used torches to investigate angles of incidence and reflection.

We have also been learning about Cubism in Art where our artist focus is Pablo Picasso. We have used oil pastels to practise drawing cubist features. We have taken photographs of ourselves and will be turning these into Cubist style self-portraits.

In **Reading**, we have been reading Floella Benjamin's 'Coming to England' and R J Palacio's 'Wonder'.
