
RECEPTION

Under the Sea

Our new starting point for learning in Spring 2 is 'Under the Sea'. On Monday, we shared 'The Rainbow Fish' to begin our new theme and discussed how to be kind, caring and share with our friends. We have been learning to repeat key phrases from the story using different character voices and using thumbs up / thumbs down to indicate when the rainbow fish was kind or mean. The children have also been exploring actions or freeze frames to show feelings in the story such as 'shocked'. Our new vocabulary includes 'emerged', 'sparkling' 'shimmer' and 'dazzle'.

On Tuesday, the children were devasted to find that the 'sea creatures' were tangled in a polluted Ocean water tray! They thought that it would be a great idea to rescue them from danger, clean them and then release them in the fresh open water tray. Lots of wonderful language and discussions relating to pollution and saving our planet. The children have also been drawing, colouring and cutting out a variety of sea creatures for our whole class aquarium art project and mixing paints together to create the prefect Ocean blue! They have been busy creating beautiful rainbow fish inspired artwork, developing narratives in the small world and closely studying gemstones, fossils and shells.







PSHE

This week, the children have learnt to sing 'When I was one'- a catchy sea shanty song! We are looking forward to performing this to you at Friday Library. A video will also be available to view on Tapestry.

We have started the half term as we mean to go on, with determination and a love of learning. This has continued from the last week of last half term, when we enjoyed finishing publishing our letters, and envelopes, before we visited the post office to send them to our families! It has been magical listening to the children talking about when their letters arrived at home.

When we arrived at school on Monday, there was a scrapheap in our classroom, full of lots of different bits. We discussed if they were broken or building bits. This led us to a discovery of a bluebird, and then a robot to hook us in to our new core text: The Robot and the Bluebird. We have been working hard in **English** this week to understand the plot and the characters from this story in more detail, through role play.

In **Maths**, we have started our unit on addition and subtraction, using our skills to count on and recapping our number bonds to 10.

In **Geography** we enjoyed starting to learn about coasts. Using maps, we identified different coastal areas in the UK, and looked at the key to see if they were seaside towns, ports, cliffs or sandy beaches.

We visited a Mosque in East Moor yesterday as part of our ongoing **RE learning**; the children shone with their existing knowledge and inquisitiveness to find out more.



What a busy, first week back! Year 2 have come back striving even higher than before and motivated to be independent learners.

On Monday afternoon, we started our half term with a visit to the beautiful Wakefield Cathedral. While exploring the features of the Cathedral, we took part in a workshop to explore the Christian beliefs, signs and symbols to reflect on our Christianity unit in RE. The workshop leaders were really impressed by our knowledge of Christianity and our inquisitiveness to find out even more!

In Maths, we have continued our unit on division. After revisiting equal groups and division, we have explored using sharing as a method of division. We worked practically using counters before progressing to drawings for our pictorial representation.

In **Science** this week, we have started our new learning on materials. We investigated real life objects so that we could investigate the properties of material and their suitability.

In **Geography**, Year 2 have been so enthusiastic about our theme of 'Africa'. Using our knowledge of Wrenthorpe, we have compared the geographical features, similarities and differences between Wrenthorpe village and a village in Africa called Mvezo. In History, we have begun learning about Nelson Mandela, why he is a significant person and the impact he has on Africa and the world.

On Wednesday, we had our yoga session which is key for taking time to be mindful and develop our mental wellbeing. Each day, we have continued to take time to practice mindfulness activities to regulate ourselves and learn to be present, calm and in the moment

YEAR 3

A brilliant start back for Year 3 into the second half of our Spring term! The children have showcased incredible retrieval knowledge and have been determined to be 1% better every day!

In English, we have loved the beginning of our new core text of 'How to Train Your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell. We explored some of our main characters mentioned in chapter 1 and 2 and then used our inference skills to discuss what our first impressions were. We gave reasons for our first impressions using the text as our evidence. Additionally, we explored the journey of emotions of our main character Hiccup by creating an emotion graph in books.

For Maths, we have begun our new topic on Fractions and have retrieved some of our key vocabulary and sentence stems from Year 2 to support our understanding. We have focused on unit and non-unit fractions, representing these in bar models as well as comparing and ordering them.

We reached our final outcomes in Art! These were clay amulets inspired by Celtic artwork and the artist Michael Carroll. We completed our evaluations where we reflected on similarities and differences in our final pieces in comparison to our focus artist. We also discussed what we would change or improve if we were to create our piece again.

In **Science**, we experimented with different magnets to see which was the strongest. We planned our experiment first and then used paper clips as our magnetic object to test our the strength of each magnet.

YEAR 4

We have had a fantastic start to Spring 2! The children have shown fantastic learning attitudes and I am so proud of their maturity as we enter the second half of Year 4!

The children have been thrilled to find out that the letters they wrote before the holidays persuading Mrs. Swinburne to plant more trees in school have worked and we are very lucky to be planting these trees ourselves very soon.

In Maths, we have begun our unit of fractions, this has been a challenging concept but with perseverance the children are overcoming this and showing great understanding.

In **English**, the children have blown me away with their enthusiasm towards our core text 'the Explorer' by Katherine Rundell. At the end of the unit we will be writing our own ending to the story so we have began looking at the setting of the story. The children have impressed me with their brilliant choice of vocabulary as well as understanding the different grammatical features which make a brilliant

sentence.

In Art, we have finished our brilliant canvas rainforest pieces inspired by the artist John Dyer. The children used acrylic paint and oil pastels to create vibrant scenes and they are so proud of their end result.



YEAR 5

Year 5 have made a fantastic start to the second half of the Spring term! Seeing such eager faces, ready to learn on Monday was a pleasure.

In **English**, we have begun our learning of 'traditional tales'. We have critiqued an example whilst identifying features we can use in our own writing. We look forward to continuing our core text, 'The Girl Who Speaks Bears' – Year 5 have suggested lots of great predictions about how they think the story will end.

In Maths, we have continued our learning of decimals. We can find equivalent fractions and decimals using tenths and hundredths. At the moment, we are learning to find equivalents using thousandths. We are striving to find equivalents between fractions, decimals and percentages.

Year 5 have evaluated their final

outcomes in art, which they are very proud of. Inspired by the artist Sue Davis, the children have produced a fantastic piece of art. They have thought carefully about sketching, limited colour palettes and how to use paint effectively.

In **Geography**, we have learnt about how tsunamis happen and how they can be caused by earthquakes. We have created our own explanation texts and diagrams showing how these work.
